Discussion of the Build Policy Collaborative Roadmap

Agenda item type: Action item

Summary

The Building Policy Collaborative Roadmap establishes a shared vision for decarbonizing the region's buildings and identifies policy pathways towards achieving that vision.

Background

The Building Policy Collaborative Roadmap is a long-term, non-mandating planning document designed to help local governments align building policies, reduce complexity, and accelerate collective progress.

The roadmap serves four primary purposes:

- establishing a shared vision for reducing climate pollution from buildings across the region,
- articulating why collaborating and coordinating across the Denver region to reduce pollution from buildings through codes and policies is important, timely and doable.
- identifying key building code and policy actions local governments can take to (1) ensure new buildings do not contribute to climate-pollution, (2) better understand how much pollution their existing buildings are creating; and (3) begin taking steps to reduce pollution from existing buildings; and
- fostering alignment, education, and action across local governments, the building industry, and the public to support the adoption of the building codes and policies necessary to accomplish the regional vision.
