Annual Review of Transportation Advisory Committee Membership

Agenda item type: Action

Summary

The Regional Transportation Committee's annual review of the Transportation Advisory Committee membership and appointment of one of the TAC's special interest seat representatives.

Background

The Transportation Advisory Committee assists the Board of Directors and the Regional Transportation Committee by reviewing the work of the transportation planning process, advising on methods of planning and implementation, and working with staff to develop policy options and, as appropriate, recommendations to the RTC.

The TAC's membership, responsibilities, and procedures are described in the [Transportation Planning Framework](#) and documented in DRCOG's [Committee Policy, Guidelines and Descriptions](#). The DRCOG Board Chair and RTC review the membership of the TAC annually. RTC also approves the TAC's Special Interest Seat representatives that are nominated by the Chair.

This annual review is meant to maintain the close bond between the Chair, RTC, and the membership and work of the TAC. From staff's perspective, there is a strong core of local government representatives and alternates who attend regularly and provide valuable input. DRCOG's website includes the [TAC's current roster](#).

There are occasional periods of transition based on local government staff changes, and the roster reflects a few local government member or alternate vacancies staff are currently working with the forums to fill. Of the nine special interest seats, one of them is at term and there is one vacancy:

- Non-motorized (Active transportation): Sue Prant. Recommending appointment.
- Equity: Angie Rivera-Malpiede. Recommending renewal.

Angie Rivera-Malpiede has expressed interested in continuing in the Equity Special Interest Seat, and DRCOG staff supports her re-appointment. Two submissions were received for the vacant Nonmotorized Special Interest Seat. DRCOG staff reviewed the qualifications and experience of each. Sue Prant, Executive Director of Community Cycles, is the most qualified candidate and is recommended to fill this seat.

Accordingly, per DRCOG's Committee Guidelines, DRCOG Board Chair Colleen Whitlow is nominating the equity special interest seat representative for another two year term and nominating the nonmotorized special interest seat representative for a new two-year term.
