



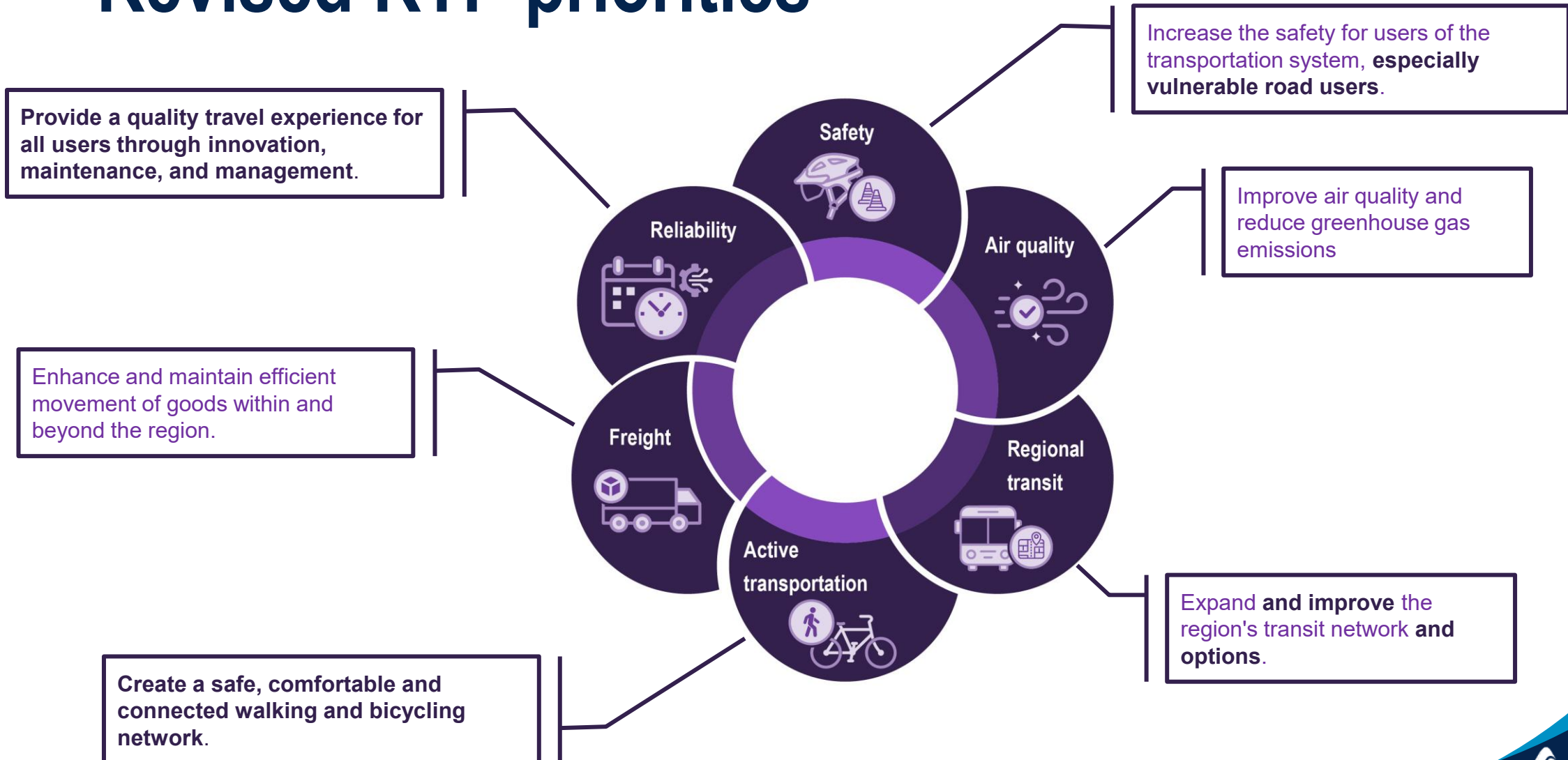

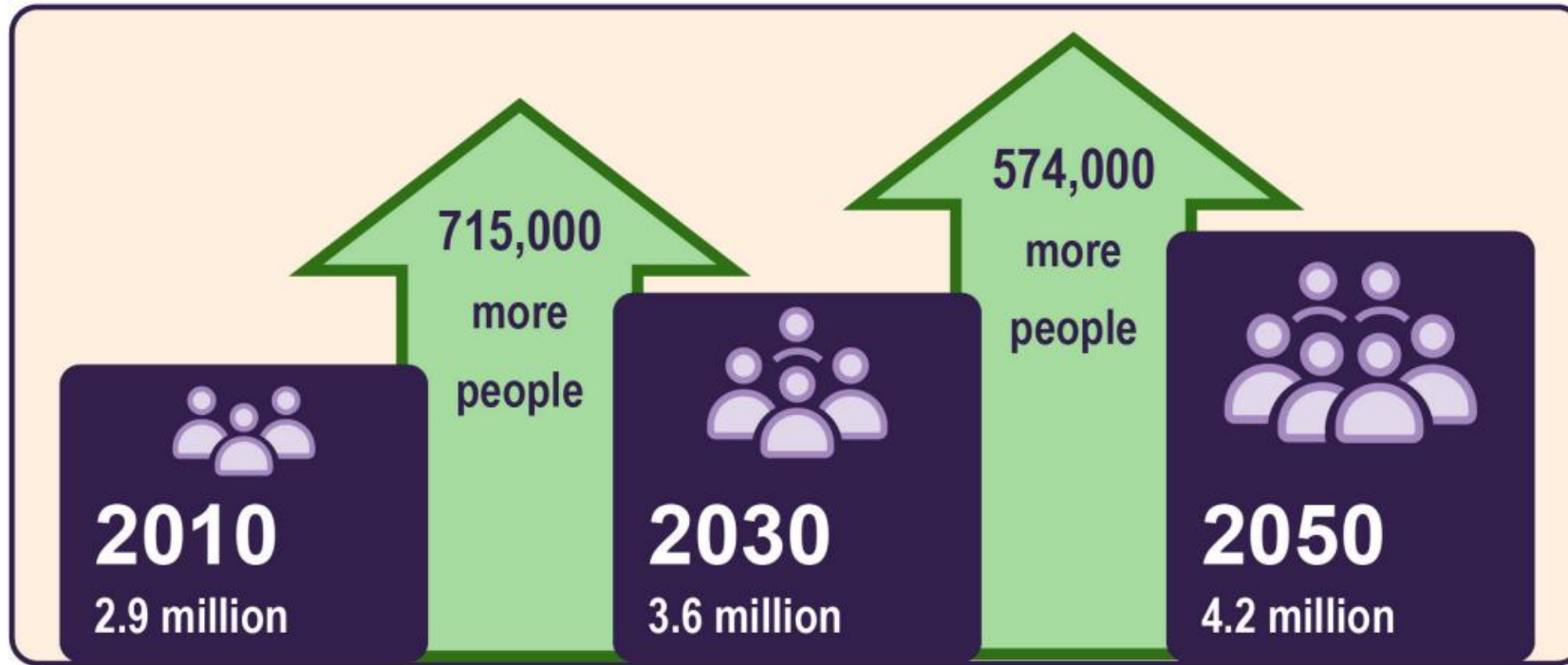
Select changes this update

Compared to the previous 2050 forecast:

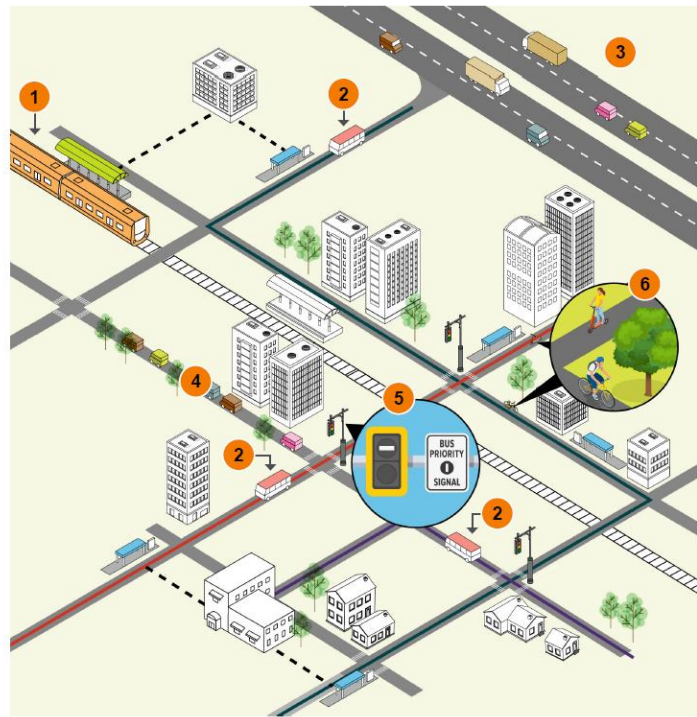
~270,000 **fewer** residents.

Seamless and efficient travel

- 1 RTD's 12 rail lines service 78 stations, helping residents and visitors travel across the region.
- 2 Buses are the backbone of transit service for RTD — nearly 65% of all trips made by RTD users are on a bus.
- 3 Busy freeways in the region move around 400,000 people a day.
- 4 Streets provide access to nearby places, support mobility and contribute to the character of the neighborhood.
- 5 Transit signal priority helps buses move more efficiently through city streets.
- 6 Travelers in the region take nearly 2 million trips by walking or bicycling every day.

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- **New design template** that meets the latest accessibility best practices.
- Updated maps using the **latest map templates**.
- Enhanced graphics that **better tell the story**.

Refreshing the document suite

- **New ‘plans review’ appendix** that provides an overview of key plans in the region and state.
 - Includes **new documents** like the Federal Land Management in the Denver Region, TDM Strategic Plan, RTO&T Strategic Plan, Regional Housing Needs Assessment, Regional Housing Strategy.
- **New ‘investment analyses’** appendix that describes potential impacts from projects.
 - Includes a **new analysis** using the Equity Index, **enhanced resilience** analysis, and **travel model outputs**.
- Pivoting from a **webmap** to a **dashboard**.
 - Structured similarly to the Crash Data Dashboard.

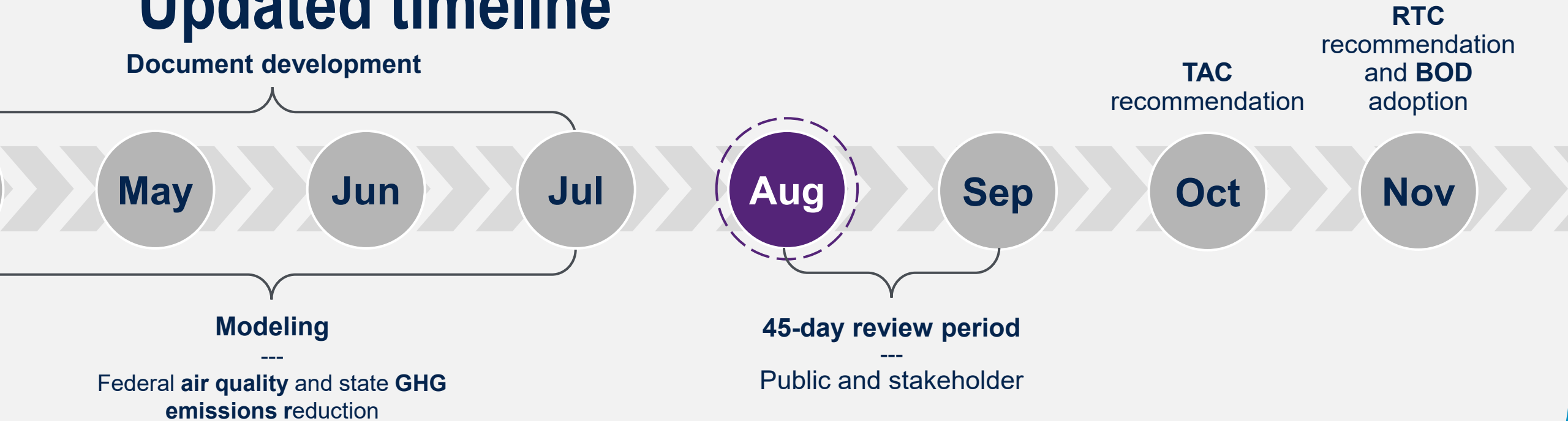
Engagement

- **Upcoming** Civic Advisory Group meeting and Public Hearing.

Updated timeline



- **45-day** public and stakeholder review beginning Aug 2.
 - Public hearing September 16.
- Interagency Air Quality Consultation Team (**IACT**), Air Quality Control Commission (**AQCC**), and Transportation Commission (**TC**) meetings.
- Federal approval **deadline December 8**.
