Summary

September 2026 administrative modifications to the 2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program.

Background

Per the Board-adopted [Policies for Transportation Improvement Program Development](#), administrative modifications to the [2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program](#) are reviewed and processed by staff. Administrative modifications represent revisions to projects that do not require formal action by the Board of Directors.

After the Board is informed of the administrative modifications, the modifications are processed and posted on the [Transportation Improvement Program web page](#). They are then emailed to the Transportation Improvement Program Notification List, which includes members of the Transportation Advisory Committee, the Regional Transportation Committee, project sponsors, staff of various federal and state agencies, and other interested parties.

Project funding transfers:

These projects involve funding transfers from one project to another. In many cases, this might be the consolidation of funding from multiple project listings into a single listing, or the merger of adjacent similar projects that will involve a combined letting. Projects are shown below paired with the other project(s) that are part of the transfer.

Under this action, the current US85 project is being closed out, and the remaining active scope and funding are being transferred to a new TIP project. This is to simplify CDOT recordkeeping for this long-running project and clean up the information listed in the TIP.

Due to the expansion of the metropolitan planning organization boundary to cover Clear Creek and Gilpin counties, the pool projects are being added to the following TIP projects to account for existing projects in these counties.
