

# 2024-2027 TIP Subregional Share Call for Projects

The Denver Regional Council of Governments is soliciting requests for funding of eligible Subregional Share projects to develop the new 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program. This is the last call for projects to allocate fiscal years 2022 through 2027 funds to both the current 2022-2025 TIP and a new 2024-2027 TIP.

This announcement serves as the official notice of the DRCOG Subregional Share Call for Projects for fiscal years 2024-2027 TIP projects, also known as Call Four. A total amount of \$192.333 million is available under this call. Two applications will be utilized:

1. One application will be for air quality and multimodal projects only and utilize available 2025, 2026 and 2027 funding, including federal Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality, federal Transportation Alternatives, federal Carbon Reduction Program and state Multimodal Transportation and Mitigation Options Funds. An estimated \$83.966 million will be available under this track. The following funding amounts are targeted for project selection to each of the following subregions, including the appropriate specific application:
  - Adams County: \$12.964 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - Arapahoe County: \$15.626 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - Boulder County: \$8.329 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - City and County of Broomfield: \$2.049 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - City and County of Denver: \$20.337 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - Douglas County: \$8.707 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - Jefferson County: \$13.854 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
  - Weld County (southwest portions within DRCOG only): \$2.099 million ([AQ/MM application](#))
2. The second application will utilize federal Surface Transportation Block Grant funding only. Eligibility is expanded to include projects that are roadway capacity, roadway reconstruction and bridge reconstruction/replacement/rehabilitation, in addition to most project types eligible under the Air Quality and Multimodal application. An estimated \$108.367 million will be available under this track distributed over 2024-2027. The following funding amounts are targeted for project selection to each of the following subregions, including the appropriate specific application:
  - Adams County: \$16.732 million ([STBG application](#))
  - Arapahoe County: \$20.167 million ([STBG application](#))
  - Boulder County: \$10.75 million ([STBG application](#))

- City and County of Broomfield: \$2.644 million ([STBG application](#))
- City and County of Denver: \$26.247 million ([STBG application](#))
- Douglas County: \$11.238 million ([STBG application](#))
- Jefferson County: \$17.881 million ([STBG application](#))
- Weld County (southwest portions within DRCOG boundaries only): \$2.709 million ([STBG application](#))

### Call for projects guidelines:

- The call is being conducted under guidance set within the adopted [Policies for TIP Program Development](#). A [quick guide](#) is also available.
- Project sponsors must have attended **at least one** of the two previous TIP trainings in February 2022 to be eligible to submit an application. If no one from your agency attended, or if you'd like to confirm someone did attend, please contact [DRCOG staff](#).
- Projects requiring Colorado Department of Transportation and/or Regional Transportation District concurrence must submit [request forms](#) to those agencies no later than Dec. 9, 2022.
- The appropriate applications, funding details and additional call information can be found on the [2024-2027 TIP Development](#) webpage. In addition to the information found on this webpage and in this email, the first page of each application contains relevant information.
- Transportation and other data to assist applicants in completing their application can be obtained from the [2024-2027 TIP Data Resources](#) webpage. Details include a link to the TIP Data Hub, which includes the TIP Data Tool (a web mapping tool to assist applicants with spatial analysis questions on the application) and links to download data for use outside of the TIP Data Tool.
- Project sponsors must submit application(s) and other required and optional documentation from a link located within the TIP Data Hub **no later than 3 p.m. on Friday, Jan. 27, 2023**.
- Once the call closes, DRCOG staff will confirm project eligibility, post all received materials and prepare scoring sheets for each subregion. Scoring sheets will then be passed along to each subregion to begin their scoring, deliberations and recommendation process. Each subregion will have approximately one month to prepare a recommendation to the DRCOG committees and Board of Directors.
