The Area Agency on Aging's Caregiver Services and Support team helps caregivers access resources in the community. The program is designed to support caregivers in all stages of the caregiving journey, offering educational tools through Powerful Tools for Caregivers classes and coaching through the Program to Encourage Active, Rewarding Lives (or PEARLS), intended for caregivers ages 60 and older who have mild to moderate depression. Education classes are also available to caregivers ages 55 and older who are providing care to adults (ages 18 to 59) with disabilities.

Case management agencies

Case management agencies help members of Health First Colorado (the state's Medicaid program) access necessary services and resources so they can live in the community with as much independence as possible. Case management agencies also assess individuals to determine eligibility for Health First Colorado programs such as Home- and Community-Based Services and waiver programs for specific needs. 

Multiple audiology clinics around the state participate in the Hearing the Call initiative to help individuals access hearing-related health care and hearing aids. Hearing clinic events are held throughout the year at locations around the state. Applications must be completed 30 days before the date of a hearing clinic event. To be eligible, applicants must have proof of financial need and a diagnosis of hearing loss in one or both ears. Documentation from a hearing test within the previous 12 months is required, as is the ability to complete 10 hours of community service. The community service requirement can be met by an applicant's family, friends or other trusted support person.

Rebuilding Together Colorado's Safe at Home and Emergency Home Repair programs provide free home repairs and modifications for eligible homeowners living in Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson counties. Repairs and modifications aim to reduce falls, increase home safety and improve fire prevention strategies. Proof of financial need is required, and homeowners must be up to date on mortgage and property tax payments. Eligible homeowners must be over age 60, a veteran or living with a disability. Homeowners who care for someone living with a disability may also be eligible for the Emergency Home Repair program.





Eligible riders must be age 60 or older and a resident of Adams, Arapahoe, Broomfield, Clear Creek, Denver, Douglas, Gilpin or Jefferson county. Riders should be able to request rides independently, although a caregiver may request transportation on a rider's behalf in certain circumstances. Access-a-Ride provides shared-ride paratransit for individuals who meet criteria established under the Americans with Disabilities Act. In general, eligible riders must be unable to use RTD's bus and rail services due to a disability. The Access-a-Ride application process includes a written application, medical verification from a licensed professional, an in-person interview and a transportation assessment. LiVE provides a 50% fare discount on RTD bus and rail services for adults ages 20 and older with a household income at or below the 250% federal poverty level. Eligible residents can apply for the LiVE program through Colorado's state benefits website, known as PEAK. Applicants can also apply via phone with assistance from Denver Human Services. Social Security numbers and proof of citizenship are not required for applications.
