### **Review of assessment results**



# Summary of key findings

- Despite periodic building booms, the region has not produced enough housing to keep pace with population and job growth.
- Low-income households (below 60% Area Median Income) represent the greatest need for additional housing.
- Aging population and smaller household trends will require more diverse housing types.
- Housing types and affordability are unevenly distributed across the region.

# **10-year regional housing needs**


| Component    | Housing units |

 The Denver region will need to produce about 216,000 new housing units between 2023-2032
to meet current and future regional housing needs.



### **Distribution of need – 2032**



Over 137,000 units for households earning 0–60% Area Median Income are needed to meet current and future demand by 2032.



# Identifying local housing needs

• Created a model for identifying the 10-year housing need to submarkets and local communities.



### Local housing data dashboard

#### **Primary Navigation Menu**

The primary navigation menu will be organized to guide users from existing conditions to forecasted needs to provide context for local numbers.

#### Secondary Navigation Menu

The secondary menu allows users to select specific visualizations nested underneath the primary menu options.

#### Jurisdiction Selector

The dropdown menu allows users to select which jurisdictions to include in the visualizations. This can be edited from any view and selections are maintained as users navigate through different options from the primary and secondary menus.








### Framing a Regional Housing Strategy



### Purpose

- Support and further Metro Vision and the 2050 Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan.
- Develop a consistent, data-informed, and equitycentered approach to analyzing and responding to housing needs.
- Foster a culture of shared responsibility for addressing housing needs.
- Build consensus around a shared vision and framework for action.
- Increase capacity within local communities to advance housing strategies and respond to evolving needs.
- Build a region that is more resilient, inclusive and equitable.





# **Guiding principles**

A regional housing strategy should...

- 1) Align with the region's equity vision for communities that offer access to opportunity and meet the needs of all races, ages, incomes, and abilities.
- 2) Be data-informed, grounded in a shared understanding of the region's diverse housing needs.
- 3) Ensure flexibility in responding to the contexts of communities across the region.
- 4) Be comprehensive in addressing the barriers to more housing and more diverse types.
- 5) **Reflect the unique roles and authorities of each sector** while facilitating collaboration and shared accountability.
- 6) **Identify resource requirements** to ensure actionable plans and deliver desired outcomes.
- 7) Balance near-term results with long-term resilience to meet housing needs under varied economic conditions.



# Implementation considerations

### **Roles and Responsibilities**

- DRCOG's role
- Lead sector/actor
- Supporting and partner sectors/actors

### **Costs and Timeline**

- Scale of investment required
- Funding sources
- Time to implementation (months, years)

### Impact

- Housing units
- Segment of housing need (income, type, etc.)
- Capacity-building

### **Immediate next steps**

- July 31st: Virtual meeting with local government staff to share report and introduce local housing data dashboard.
- Late July/August: Publish Request for Proposals for Regional Housing Strategy.
- August 6-21: Bookable office hours with DRCOG staff for local government staff on local housing data dashboard.
- August 8: Presentation at City and County Managers meeting.
- **Fall:** Future Board agenda items on local housing data dashboard and assessment acceptance.
