State Senate Bill 25-030: Planned bicycle, pedestrian and transit projects inventory

Agenda item type: Informational Briefing

Summary

As required by [Senate Bill 25-030](#), the Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) is compiling an inventory of planned bicycle, pedestrian and transit projects in local governments inside the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) area.

Background

[Senate Bill 25-030](#) requires metropolitan planning organizations and the Colorado Department of Transportation to collect planned bicycle, pedestrian and transit project inventories from local governments with more than 5,000 people by December 31, 2025. DRCOG staff is compiling this inventory for local governments in the Denver MPO area.

Planned bicycle, pedestrian and transit projects can come from a wide range of plans or studies including, but not limited to, capital improvement plans, transportation plans, comprehensive plans, and corridor or subarea plans. The list of projects can include bicycle infrastructure (travelways and supportive infrastructure), pedestrian infrastructure (sidewalks and supportive infrastructure), and transit service and facilities (fixed-route or on-demand).

This effort is not intended to capture transit operations or maintenance of existing routes and services, active transportation education or encouragement programs, plans or studies, data collection efforts or count programs.

Local governments must submit their list of planned projects by December 31, 2025 using [DRCOG's upload form](#).
