1. DRCOG TIP

- 2018-2021 TIP: Todd Cottrell said administrative modifications and policy amendments are both due December 28th. Todd also noted that project delays and ALOP (Annual Listing of Obligated Projects) were presented to TAC in December and will go to RTC and the Board in January. After the January Board, ALOP information will then be posted on the DRCOG website.
- 2020-2023 TIP: Todd summarized the regional share project funding recommendations and the schedule for presentation to DRCOG committees and Board. With removal of the 16th St. Mall project from the waiting list by the Board in December, the revised funding recommendations will come back to RTC in January to obtain an identical action. There was discussion about schedule implications if the regional share project funding recommendations need to come back to the Board again. Todd also summarized the schedule for the subregional share funding call.

2. DRCOG MVRTP

- Jacob Riger summarized the transportation amendments received during the solicitation for proposed amendments to the 2040 MVRTP and Metro Vision Plan. He briefly reviewed the schedule for this cycle of amendments. He also gave a brief look-ahead to 2050 MVRTP planning efforts.

3. Other DRCOG Items

- DRCOG staff provided updates on other DRCOG activities, including the Active Transportation Plan, Vision Zero Action Plan, Mobility Choice Blueprint, DRCOG freight plan, UPWP end of year report, new UPWP (work starting in 2019), DRCOG's draft new public engagement plan, and other activities.
- Bill Haas noted that FHWA is bringing a truck parking workshop to Colorado. He also noted FHWA's 2016 certification finding regarding DRCOG's public involvement process and evaluating its effectiveness. DRCOG staff said this finding is specifically addressed in the new public engagement plan.
- Tim Kirby asked about modeling connected/autonomous vehicles and other travel model enhancements based on the Mobility Choice Blueprint process.

4. Federal MPO Performance Targets

- Jacob provided an update on DRCOG's current efforts to set remaining FAST Act-required targets.

5. CDOT Headquarters and Regions 1 and 4 updates

- Tim Kirby noted staff changes underway.
- Region 1 did not have any updates.
- Region 4 staff noted interest in a PEL/ACP (Planning & Environmental Linkages/Access Control Plan) for SH-52. Segments 7 & 8 of I-25 North are in full construction. Bill requested a meeting in early 2019 to discuss the Consolidated Record of Decision for I-25 North.

6. Transit updates

- Chris Quinn said fare increases will be implemented in January. He also discussed RTD's submittal to the Federal Railroad Administration regarding the commuter rail lines. Trainset capacity will be doubled on the University of Colorado A Line because of high ridership.
- Matthew Helfant provided an update on the VTCLI (Veterans Transportation Community Living Initiative) project. Staff also summarized the new Human Service Transportation set-aside in the 2020-2023 TIP.

7. FHWA updates

- Bill said the agency is currently working under a Continuing Resolution that ends on Friday; there may be another short-term CR. He noted Colorado received three BUILD grant awards. FHWA is requesting to hold in Colorado a Planning for Reliability workshop. Finally, he also noted Tracey MacDonald is FTA's new director of the Office of Planning & Program Development.

- NFRMPO updates
 - Becky Karasko updated the ICG on the current TIP and 2040 RTP amendment conformity schedule (AQCC March/April), as well as for the 2045 plan. NFR received 12 CMAQ applications in their call for projects.
- RAQC updates
 - Amanda Brimmer talked about need for 2016 and 2017 staging years. Tim Russ reported that he had not heard specifically about whether an interpolation will be allowed and will meet with OTAQ to get a final decision.
 - Because of the timeline, the RAQC will likely need a 1-year extension from EPA to complete a new Serious SIP and get it approved by AQCC and the Colorado legislature.
- APCD Updates
 - The ZEV Hearing has been delayed until May
- DRCOG Updates
 - Jacob Riger and Robert Spotts shared the modeling assumptions for land use and transportation networks for ICG review. No comments were received from the ICG.
