## 2. All About E-Bikes Panel

### *GoSGV E-Bike Share for the San Gabriel Valley*

Caitlin Sims, San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments, gave an overview of the GoSGV Regional Bikeshare Program. The GoSGV bike share program is a subscription-based program that allows residents to reserve an e-bike for monthly use.<sup>1</sup>

### *City and County of Denver's E-Bike Rebate Program Update*

Mike Salisbury, City and County of Denver, gave an update on the City of Denver's E-Bike and E-Cargo Bike instant rebate program. Vouchers are released online every other month. Vouchers are \$300 for standard e-bikes and \$500 for e-cargo bikes.<sup>2</sup>

### *Northeast Transportation Connections Bike Libraries*

Nick Glenn, Northeast Transportation Connections, gave an overview of NETC's community bike libraries. NETC operates three community bike libraries in the Globeville, Elyria, and Swansea neighborhoods. Members can use a bike for up to one week at a time, with regular check-ins. The libraries have both acoustic and electric bikes, and each bike comes with a helmet and lock.<sup>3</sup>

### *City of Boulder's Shared Micromobility and E-Bike Incentives*

Chris Hagelin, City of Boulder, gave an update on the City of Boulder's BCycle bike share program as well as the City's upcoming e-bike incentive program. The incentive program will launch later this summer and will provide Boulder residents with a discount voucher to purchase an e-bike. Applications will be released online and randomly selected. Income eligible applicants will receive a larger discount to cover the upfront costs associated with e-bike equipment.<sup>4</sup>

### *City of Longmont's CARES E-Bike Rebate*

Eliana Lanz, City of Longmont, gave an overview of the 2022 Longmont Power and Communications E-Bike Rebate program. As the municipal electric utility, LPC provided rebates to residents of Longmont for \$500 for standard rebates and up to \$1,000 for income qualified residents. Rebates were given within 30 days of purchase with proof of receipt. Bikes were eligible to be purchased in store in Longmont or online.<sup>5</sup>

## SUMMARY

The AMP Working Group will have four informational briefings at the August meeting:

### *Regional BRT Partnership*

DRCOG, in partnership with CDOT, RTD, City of Aurora, and City of Denver, is working to streamline, collaborate, and assist multiple priority bus rapid transit (BRT) corridors simultaneously. Initial focus will be on corridors including E. Colfax, Alameda Ave, Colorado, Federal, and SH-119. Jacob Riger, DRCOG, will present an overview of the partnership.

### *RTD Partnership Program*

In 2023, RTD established a new Partnership Program that allows local governments and transportation management associations (TMAs) with the RTD boundary to apply for funding to establish additional transit or mobility services. Eligible services include fixed route transit service, on-demand transit services, and other projects that enhance community mobility. Infrastructure investments are not eligible under the partnership program. On June 1, RTD released the 2023 call for projects with \$2 million in funding available. Applications were due on July 7 and will be scored by RTD staff. Announcements are expected in September.<sup>1</sup> Charlie Stanfield, RTD, will present an overview and update on the program.

### *City of Golden Ore Cart Free Transit Service*

The City of Golden, in partnership with the West Line Corridor Collaborative and Colorado School of Mines, has launched a free shuttle service pilot with several different pilot routes. The shuttle is free to all users and is ADA accessible. The goal of the shuttle is to expand access to existing transit options, including the RTD 16 bus route as well as the W and G light rail lines. Shuttle service will include both fixed route and on-demand services. Future routes will be subject to community feedback.<sup>2</sup> Matt Wempe will present an overview of the pilot program and services.

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*Community Accelerated Mobility Project (CAMP)*

The Community Accelerated Mobility Project (CAMP) is a new grant program from the Colorado Energy Office designed to fund community led projects with an electric mobility component. Eligible project types include electric carshare, electric vanpool, community e-bike share, community electric charging infrastructure, and others. Full implementation of CAMP will occur in 2024.<sup>3</sup> Carrie Atiyeh and Ed Piersa, CEO, will present an overview of the program.
