Call to Order

Chair Debra Baskett called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

Public Comments

There were no public comments.

Summary of June 22, 2015 Meeting

The meeting summary was accepted as written.

ACTION ITEMS

<u>Discussion on a waiting list and selection protocol for projects not funded in the 2016-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).</u>

Todd Cottrell presented a continuation of the discussion from last month's meeting in June. He noted the June TAC was generally in favor of a ranked waiting list, Option 3 (Assigned DRCOG funding program for each project type), but requested further discussion on the placement of studies within Option 3.

Discussion on Studies Placement in Waiting List

Mr. Cottrell presented two alternatives for further committee consideration on the placement of studies within Option 3: <u>Alternative A</u>, with an emphasis on implementation of 2040 RTP Projects; and <u>Alternative B</u>, utilizing TIP Second Phase criteria. Staff recommended Alternative A, with studies inserted in a ranked order, just preceding each comparatively-ranked roadway project using STP-Metro (as shown in Attachment 6).

During the discussion, a third alternative was suggested for the committee to consider moving studies to the top of the list, with mixed support and opposition.

Lenna Kottke MOVED to recommend Attachment 4 (Alternative A, ranking of studies based on implementation of 2040 RTP projects) to determine the order of ranking studies. The motion was seconded. The MOTION passed (by voice), with one abstention.

Bob Manwaring MOVED to recommend the waiting list as depicted in Attachment 6 (Option 3-with Alternative A studies incorporated). The motion was seconded.

Chair Baskett called the question. A vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously (18).

<u>Discussion on Waiting List Protocol</u>

Todd Cottrell presented staff's proposal to update Waiting List Protocol language (Attachment 7) to state that sponsors would be notified of funding availability when either \$1 million is available and confirmed by CDOT for DRCOG to reprogram, **or** when the next-in-line project can be funded at 100% of its federal request. It was noted, if any funding is available at end of FY18 (Sept. 30, 2018), regardless of the amount available, an attempt would be made to allocate those funds to waiting list projects.

Several clarifications were made by staff in response to questions:

- The order of funding is based on project rank—if the project's rank order indicates it is next in line for funding, that sponsor would be given "right of first refusal".
- A waiting list project that accepts partial funding remains eligible for more funding in the future.
- If a sponsor declines funding, the project would not fall off the rank list.
- The TIP delay clock starts when funding is accepted and programmed in TIP by the Board.
- TIP projects that are partially funded in First Phase and/or Second Phase are eligible for the waiting list.

Member Comments (Waiting List Protocol):

- Steve Klausing noted the Pool funding protocol is different, as a Pool project sponsor that has
 accepted partial funding cannot accept further funding. He felt the Pool policy should apply
 as well to the waiting list policy.
- Heather Balser felt if sponsors accept partial funding, they should be taken off the list, but she agreed if an eligible sponsor doesn't take funding, they should remain on the waiting list.
- Art Griffith agreed with partially funded projects staying on the list.
 - He said a partially-funded project that says it can continue without further funding should not be able to stay on waiting list.
 - He suggested <u>specific</u> language be included to state if a waiting list project passes on a funding opportunity, it will be allowed to stay at the same place on list for further funding opportunity.
- Steve Klausing asked for clarification on the wording for 2A in the Waiting List Protocol that states: ".... If the amount of funds available is less than the requested cost of that project, the sponsor will be asked if it would be willing to complete the entire project as submitted for the amount of funds available." Mr. Klausing said this is not what is being discussed and should say, to the effect, "the Sponsor agrees to accept partial additional funds applied to its project, but is not expected to complete the entire project with this funding."
- Steve Klausing felt the waiting list protocol should weigh more towards funding roadway projects, by assuring that if a waiting list roadway project passes on additional funding, this available amount goes to the next eligible roadway project on the list.
- Aylene MacCallum said policies need to be in place prior to TIP application, so that sponsors can strategize on submittals. She said every project application, including studies which were not scored, should be scored.
- Bryan Weimer emphasized adding language to clarify that if a sponsor accepts partial funding, the sponsor's project would not be removed from list or lose its ranking, and would still be eligible for more funding.

Jim Taylor MOVED to table the Waiting List Protocol discussion until next month, as it needs more clarification. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

Staff will review comments received on waiting list protocol for further discussion at next month's meeting.

Discussion on the summary of comments received at the 2016-2021 TIP Open Forum.

Todd Cottrell presented a summary of the comments received at the TIP Open Forum on June 17. The forum was held to review the 2016-2021 TIP process and elicit suggestions to improve the process.

Doug Rex noted a policy-level Board review of the TIP process is scheduled for the August Board meeting. Mr. Rex was requested by Board officers, just prior to this meeting, to have the TAC prepare a list of top issues identified at the Open Forum to provide for the August Board. To begin the process to identify top issues, particularly policy-level issues, Mr. Rex requested TAC's confirmation that the summary accurately reflected the comments received at the Open Forum.

Chair Baskett said this recent Board Officer request changes this TAC discussion from a confirmation of the summary, to identifying and prioritizing TIP process issues for Board review in August.

Art Griffith MOVED to accept the summary of comments received at the June 17 TIP Open Forum (Attachment 1). The motion was seconded.

Some members said they could not accept or endorse the summary, as they did not attend the Open Forum. Art Griffith withdrew the MOTION.

Some observations on the TIP process during the discussion included:

- The TIP process is problematic—we need to get the technical policy and process in place well in advance, and not on an ad-hoc basis, and then integrate with Board policy. Suggested getting TIP workgroup together, technically first, then with the Board. There is a disconnect in the process between what the technical group suggests, and what the Board ultimately does. Board is not as supportive of the technical recommendations as they ought to be, because there are policy considerations that are not part of what the technical group is doing.
- The process gets tweaked every year, but needs to be looked at in-depth. Fundamentally, the TIP is a policy issue first and foremost, then the technical side.
- Suggested requiring a floor-level request amount for projects (except for Very Small Communities), because of the cost of federalizing a project.
- The whole program needs to be reassessed.
- The overall feeling at the Open Forum was that attendees, including staff, were strongly in agreement the TIP process needed to be modified.

After this discussion, Doug Rex said he would advise the Board Officers and Executive Director that the committee would like additional time to identify and prioritize TIP process issues for Board review.

As a result, the following 2016-2021 TIP revision and new project is proposed:
 - Amendment #2 Anschutz Medical Campus Shuttle (2016-012): removal of CMAQ funds and replace with local RTD funds
 - Amendment #3 Intercity Bus Purchase (New Project): purchase four intercity buses using CMAQ funds transferred from TIPID 2016-012



PROPOSED ACTION/RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation on the protocol for selecting projects from the waiting list should future funding become available for the 2016-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

ACTION BY OTHERS

July 27, 2015 TAC 2016-2021 TIP Waiting List recommended.

SUMMARY

Last month, TAC continued a discussion from June on the waiting list protocol and ranked order lists of projects, ultimately providing a recommendation to MVIC on a waiting list. Option 3 was recommended, with studies ranked considering their relationship to 2040 RTP projects (see Attachment 1). A discussion about the protocol will continue at the August meeting.

Protocol for selecting waiting list projects

The waiting list protocol outlines the procedures to follow if additional funds become available. Staff provided TAC a marked-up draft in July, but after discussion, action was tabled until this month.

Staff reviewed the discussion/questions from last month and provides the following responses for clarification:

 If a sponsor of a project on the waiting list is asked if they would be willing to accept less federal funds than originally requested to complete a project and they accept, should the now partially-funded project remain on the waiting list?

Example: If \$1 million was available, and a sponsor that requested \$2.5 million to complete ranked "project #1," should the project remain on the waiting list in the same position with a \$1.5 million remaining request?

- Historically, in situations described above, the project would continue to exist on the waiting list in the same ranked position with the remaining balance of the funds requested.
- If a sponsor of a project on the waiting list is offered the available funding (full or partial) and they <u>decline</u> (project is skipped over), should the project remain on the list or be removed?

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Example: If sponsor of "project #1" declines the funding offer, and the money goes to "project #2," should "project #1" remain on the waiting list for the next round of funding availability?

 Historically, a skipped project would remain on the waiting list and not be removed.

Staff has further revised the draft redlined protocol in order to address the discussion at the July meeting (Attachment 2). Additional changes are shown in blue font.

ATTACHMENT 2

2016-2021 TIP Waiting List Protocol

(Revised from July 17, 2015 Draft Language)

If additional funds become available in the first three years of the TIP (FY 2016-2018), DRCOG staff will initiate the process to allocate funds to waiting list projects as described below. First contact sponsors to try to advance (move forward) projects. Additional funding that becomes available in FY2019 will be rolled over and included with the Call for Projects in the next TIP. This protocol does not apply to any TIP set-asides, pool programs, or projects not on the waiting list.

When DRCOG staff is informed of additional funds, the following steps will be followed:

- 1. Obtain official verification from CDOT of availability of funds.
- 1.2. When either a) \$1 million is accrued within one of the two specific funding program categories (STP-Metro or CMAQ/TAP) or b) an amount equal to 100% of the next-in-line (top-ranked) project funding request is accrued, staff will first contact sponsors of projects already in the TIP to try to advance project phases. Staff will then sSelect projects in order from the waiting list(s) included in Appendix E of the 2016-2021 TIP to the limit of applicable funds available.
 - a. Contact the sponsor of the top ranked project on the waiting list, by funding category to determine the sponsor's interest in being selected. If the amount of funds available is less than the requested cost of that project, the sponsor will be asked if it would be willing to complete the entire project as submitted for the amount of funds available. Projects that accept partial funding will remain on the list. If the response is no, or if all the available funds have not been fully allocated, DRCOG staff will proceed to the next project on the waiting list. Sponsors that request to be passed over on the funding opportunity will remain on the waiting list.
 - b. At the end of FY 2018 (September 30, 2018), even if less than \$1 million has accrued within a funding category, staff will go down the wait list in accordance with section 2.a. above to allocate available funds.
- 2.3. Recommend projects to be programmed and take them through the committee process to the Board as TIP Amendments.
