SUMMARY

The DRCOG Regional TDM Program has up to \$3.9 million available to carry out TDM activities for FY 2016 and FY 2017, combined. The 2016-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), as adopted by DRCOG's Board of Directors, has programmed \$3.6 million of Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) funds to the DRCOG Regional TDM Program in FY 2016 under TIP ID #2012-064. Up to \$300,000 in additional CMAQ funding may be carried over from previous years and available to fund Regional TDM Program activities in FY 2016 and FY 2017.

These funds are used to operate and market the region's Way to Go partnership, and provide a variety of TDM services. These services include maintaining and marketing a website called MyWayToGo.org that assists commuters and the general public in forming carpools and planning trips by other non-single occupant vehicle modes of transportation, marketing and administering a vanpool program, promotion of public transit commuting, bicycle commuting, and telework.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE CONTRACTS WITH THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (CDOT) TO CARRY OUT THE DRCOG REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT (TDM) PROGRAM'S FY 2016 AND FY 2017 ACTIVITIES.

WHEREAS, the 2016-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), as adopted by DRCOG's Board of Directors, has programmed \$3.6 million of Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) funds to the DRCOG Regional TDM Program (branded as Way to Go) in FY 2016 under TIP ID# 2012-064; and

WHEREAS, up to \$300,000 in additional CMAQ carry-over funds may become available to pay for additional activities under DRCOG's Regional TDM Program; and

WHEREAS, CMAQ funds programmed for fiscal year 2016 will cover DRCOG's Regional TDM Program activities in FY 2016 and FY 2017; and

WHEREAS, funds allocated under TIP ID #2012-064 are intended to provide a variety of TDM services; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to contract with CDOT to receive these funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Administrative Committee authorizes the Executive Director to negotiate and execute contracts with CDOT to carry out FY 2016 and FY 2017 Regional TDM Program activities as identified in the adopted 2016-2021 Transportation Improvement Program, TIP ID #2012-064, in a total amount not to exceed \$3.9 million, which includes \$3.6 million programmed in the 2016-2021 TIP and up to \$300,000 in additional carry-over funds.

**DENVER REGIONAL COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS
NOMINEES FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS
February 17, 2016**

Pat Cronenberger has served her community of Littleton and the region for many years. She was elected to the Littleton City Council in 1987, and then elected Mayor of Littleton, serving from 1997-1999. She served on the DRCOG Board of Directors and later worked for the organization as the Board and Legislative Liaison. She was appointed by the Governor to serve on the Urban Drainage and Flood Control Board, chaired the Telecommunications Committee while a member of the Metro Mayors Caucus, served on the National League of Cities, and was a Transit Alliance Board Member.

Art Griffith is the Capital Improvements Manager with the Douglas County Department of Public Works. He has been an active contributor to DRCOG transportation committees over 10 years. Art is not shy about proposing innovative ideas and solutions to planning logjams. He has worked on several key projects and corridors over the years, examples include: C-470 Express Lanes, Santa Fe/C-470 Interchange, US-85 south, SE LRT Extension, and bridges associated with the C-470 Bike Path. The region's citizens enjoy a better multimodal transportation system because of Art's contributions.

Jeff Kullman has been a member of the DRCOG Regional Transportation Committee since November 2014. He chairs the Adams County Economic Development Council's Transportation Committee and serves as chair of the MOVE Colorado board. Jeff was the Region 1 Regional Transportation Director for CDOT and was a long-serving CDOT employee before retiring and taking a senior level position with Atkins Global. Jeff knows the DRCOG transportation challenges firsthand and is an ardent supporter of increased transportation funding. Over the past several years, Jeff has made certain that Atkins Global is a sponsor of the DRCOG Awards Dinner.

Angie Malpiedes has served as the Executive Director of Northeast Transportation Connections since 2002, where she advocates and implements programs that encourage the use of alternative transportation and better community connections. She also serves as the Vice President of Stapleton Foundation. Previously she served as a Director on the RTD Board and chaired the Civil Rights Committee. She's also served on the Mayor's Pedestrian Advisory Council, the American Public Transportation Association Board, and the Denver Center for Crime Victims.

Kathleen Osher has been the Executive Director of the Transit Alliance since 2005. She developed the model for citizen's engagement that is unique in the nation. The Transit Academy is designed to educate and motivate community stakeholders by encouraging involvement in the ongoing development of transit-oriented projects in our region. Prior to Transit Alliance, Kathleen was the Transportation Manager for what is now the Denver South TMA.

Ed Peterson is a former DRCOG Board Chair (2009) and has served as a member of the DRCOG Regional Transportation Committee or an alternate since April 2008 and chaired the RTC between March 2009 and February 2010. Ed also served on the Metro Vision

Implementation Task Force and was instrumental in guiding the discussion forward on major issues for Metro Vision to consider, including the challenges surrounding Colorado's Construction Defects legislation. He was appointed to the CDOT Transportation Commission representing District 2 in November 2011. Ed is a former Lakewood City Councilman.

Senator Pat Steadman has been a State Senator since 2009. During that time, Senator Steadman has been a consistent supporter and advocate for DRCOG's Aging programs and services. Specifically, he has been an indispensable champion on the Joint Budget Committee of DRCOG's efforts to increase State Funding for Senior Services in 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. With his eloquent support of our efforts, state funding to the Area Agencies on Aging increased \$13.5 million over that four year period. Senator Steadman also played a critical role in the State Senate during the 2015 session in ensuring passage of the DRCOG-sponsored legislation (HB15-1033) to establish the Strategic Action Planning Group on Aging. As a result of Senator Pat Steadman's support and advocacy, older adults in the DRCOG region and throughout the state have been able to access greatly needed services. The state and local governments will also benefit from the strategic planning process to prepare for the aging of the population.

Cris White is the current CEO and Executive Director for Colorado Housing and Finance Authority. Cris served as vice-chair of the Sustainable Communities Initiative Executive Board and was instrumental in facilitating strong and productive relationships with the housing community across the Denver region. Cris has provided insight into the challenges for workforce and affordable housing to the DRCOG Board's Ad Hoc Committee on housing, and was a frequent commenter at DRCOG Board meetings throughout the SCI process, working closely with the SCI Executive Committee chairman, Jim Taylor. In the last several years, Cris has facilitated having CHFA serve as a sponsor for the DRCOG Awards Dinner.

Planimetric Data Group

In 2015, DRCOG embarked on an ambitious and unprecedented project to acquire detailed infrastructure information for the entire region. This specialty data (known collectively as "Planimetric data") consists of information like building outlines, sidewalks, parking lots and structures, and pavement information drawn through interpretation of aerial imagery. This valuable information is cost prohibitive for most of the region's jurisdictions to acquire and maintain, so most use outdated information or nothing at all.

Past experience has shown DRCOG that we have incredible member governments and partners in the region, so we decided to draw on those resources to solve this problem. Twenty-one agencies stepped up to this challenge and contributed funding to the purchase of data for the region. Already this data is being put to good use for pedestrian-routing, building inventories, mobile apps to aid the visually impaired, impervious surface analysis, management of special district assets, creating fire preplan maps, and sidewalk quality and availability studies.

Without the participation and contribution of these 21 data visionaries, this project could not have happened. Their foresight to imagine the process improvements, innovative research, and entrepreneurship fostered by this data shows their commitment to regionalism.

Christensen in promoting and working for good, strong, representative local government and regionalism in solving mutual problems.

Eligible Are:

- ✓ Any elected official or private individual, excluding DRCOG staff members and DRCOG Administrative Committee members.
- ✓ Residents of Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Clear Creek, Douglas, Gilpin, Jefferson, or Weld counties, the City & County of Broomfield and the City & County of Denver.
- ✓ Individuals making substantial contributions to the Philosophy of Regionalism, either during the past year or over a longer period of time.
- ✓ Nominees whose names have been submitted for consideration the previous two years.

The Nominee(s) must have demonstrated dedication to regionalism by:

- ✓ Promotion of coordination and cooperation among citizens and local elected officials in a continuing effort to solve regional problems.
- ✓ Recognizing that jurisdictional boundaries are not barriers to the solution of such problems.
- ✓ Providing leadership to, or support for, the concept that strong local government representation is the basis for regional accomplishment.

Nomination Process:

- ✓ Nominations must include a description of the achievement, accompanied by an explanation of the nominee's (nominees') philosophy of regionalism. The narrative should be in sufficient detail to assist the Administrative Committee in its selection.
- ✓ Nominations must be mailed to the DRCOG Administrative Committee at 1290 Broadway, Suite 700, Denver, 80203-5606 by January 29, 2016 for judging by the Administrative Committee at its February meeting.
- ✓ If the Administrative Committee determines that no nominee fully meets established criteria, no award will be made.
- ✓ Announcement of the winner and presentation of the award will be made at the DRCOG Awards Dinner.
