

Increase opportunities for diverse housing accessible by multimodal transportation












VARIETY OF HOUSEHOLDS AND DEMAND



PRE-RETREAT SURVEY

- DRCOG Board Survey on Housing – Sample actions that local governments have taken
 - Supported a housing authority
 - Created plans to address homelessness
 - Supported eviction defense programs and emergency rental assistance
 - Completed housing study
 - Amended Zoning to allow ADUs





BOARD RETREAT TAKE AWAYS





- Housing Question Storming Activity illuminated the complexity of housing challenges for local communities and identified key questions
- Role Identification Exercise identified three key roles for DRCOG:
 - Data
 - Regional Planning
 - Convening

THEMES FROM BOARD WORK SESSION - DEC. 7, 2022



- Convening, coordination, and project management are needed
- Data analysis and technical assistance that focuses on areas that local governments cannot address alone
- Policies and programs that are accessible across communities
- Broad and impactful communication strategies
- Development of shared goals and desired outcomes
