#### **Public Comment**

No public comment was received.

## <u>Update on I-25 corridor planning and construction activities</u>

Paul Jesaitis, CDOT Region 1 Transportation Director, provided an overview of the I-25 updates the Board would be receiving. Over the past several years, planning studies and construction projects have occurred in various segments of the I-25 corridor in the DRCOG region. CDOT staff used an interactive map to present recent and current planning studies; current, planned, and future construction projects; and emerging corridor issues:

- Jessica Myklebust, Deputy Director of Program Delivery, provided a background on the importance of the I-25 projects to improve mobility along the corridor.
- Alazar Tesfaye, Region 1 Traffic Program Engineer, presented and discussed the following new projects:
  - I-25 Southbound Bottleneck project between I-76 and I-70, which will cost about \$1.5 million to complete.
  - Enhanced Wrong Way signage and marking at all exit ramps, which will be about 66 ramps total, on I-25 within Region 1.
  - Wrong Way crash prevention I-25 Express Ramp and 70<sup>th</sup> Ave. This will be the initial location for a series of wrong-way sensors and alert systems on I-25 off-ramps
  - I-25 Ramp meter installation with a total construction cost of \$3.8 million.
     This will improve traffic flow by letting vehicles onto the highway one at a time.
  - Region 1 6-inch lane line markings will improve visibility and safety. This
    project will hopefully be completed by November.
- Andy Stratton, Region 1 North Program Engineer, presented and discussed the following new projects:
  - o Improvements along I-25 will include the addition of a managed lane in each direction and a mobility hub at SH-7.
  - The SH-7 to SH-66 segment and SH-66 to WCR 38 segment in Region 4 will add 1 toll/managed lane in each direction, costing around \$325 million.
  - I-270 Direct Connects project will add express lanes connections at US 36/I-25. The cost is estimated at \$300 million, with an estimated \$450 million in toll revenues.
- Jay Hendrickson, Region 1 Central Program Engineer, presented and discussed the following new projects:
  - Colfax to 20<sup>th</sup> operational improvements will include the reconstruction of the Speer and 23<sup>rd</sup> Bridges and the addition of collector/distributor roads and new ramps.
  - Phase II Santa Fe to Alameda operational improvements will include the Alameda Bridge over the South Platte River.
  - Valley Highway improvements along the Santa Fe to Colfax corridor will include managed lanes, the addition of collector/distributor roads, braided ramps, and replacement of all bridges.
  - The Smart 25: Managed Motorways Demonstration will deploy traffic sensors for coordinated ramp metering.
- Carrie DeJiacomo, Region 1 South Program Engineer, presented and discussed the following new projects:

- Belleview Interchange improvements and/or reconstruction are on the 10year projects list and could include either an addition of a single point urban interchange or a split diamond with Union.
- The development of a new transit station in Castle Rock, which is estimated to cost \$30 million.
- I-25 South Gap project will include, widening, bride replacements, and upgrade drainage facilities. It is projected to be completed in 2022 and is estimated to cost \$350 million.

#### Update on the Front Range Passenger Rail planning process

Randy Grauberger, Front Range Passenger Rail Project Director, provided a project update on recent/current activities and next steps to the Board members. The project includes technical, stakeholder, and public engagement tasks focusing on feasible passenger rail service along the Front Range from Fort Collins to Pueblo/Trinidad. The effort is now in Level 2 analysis that is comparing various possible alignments based on potential ridership, travel times, and benefits/impacts.

#### SUMMARY

#### Background

As the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), DRCOG leads a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive (3C) multimodal transportation planning process for the Denver region. Part of that responsibility includes developing a long-range transportation plan in cooperation with the State and public transportation operators. Also known as the Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan (MVRTP), it helps implement the Metro Vision Plan and sets the framework for the Transportation Improvement Program. Transportation Planning in the Denver Region specifies the roles of each of the partner agencies (DRCOG, CDOT, and RTD) in developing the MVRTP (Exhibit 7).

Based on the 2050 MVRTP candidate project solicitation/evaluation process and criteria adopted by the DRCOG Board at its <u>July 15, 2020 meeting</u>, DRCOG staff worked with the county transportation forums, mountain counties, CDOT, and RTD to solicit and evaluate major multimodal candidate projects for potential inclusion in the 2050 Fiscally Constrained Regional Transportation Plan. This memo and presentation (Attachment 1) provide an update on the candidate solicitation and evaluation process and present the proposed 2050 MVRTP fiscally constrained project and program investment priorities for discussion at the November 4<sup>th</sup> Board work session and action at the November RTC and Board meetings. The fiscally constrained project investment priorities include the 2050 MVRTP fiscally constrained roadway capacity and rapid transit networks to model for air quality conformity.

As a reminder, the 2050 MVRTP must:

- individually identify regionally significant roadway capacity and rapid transit projects (priority project investments),
- demonstrate that revenues will be reasonably expected to be available to fund these priority project investments through 2050 (fiscal constraint), and
- identify the five- or ten-year implementation "staging period" of each project for air quality conformity modeling purposes.

#### Candidate Project Solicitation & Evaluation Process

DRCOG received a total of 137 candidate multimodal projects to evaluate through the project solicitation process from the county transportation forums, mountain counties, CDOT, and RTD. The candidate projects were qualitatively scored by DRCOG staff from the Transportation Planning & Operations and Regional Planning & Development divisions against the primary objectives in DRCOG's Metro Vision Plan as well as required performance criteria in the federal FAST Act (shown in the candidate project solicitation form). Attachment 2 is a table of the candidate projects received, their average and total scores, and the ranking each county transportation forum assigned to their projects for those forums that ranked their candidate project submittals.

As DRCOG staff has emphasized throughout the 2050 MVRTP planning process, candidate project qualitative scoring is one important component of – but not the sole factor in – developing fiscally constrained project recommendations. However, the project scoring does provide an overall <u>relative</u> sense of how well the candidate projects might address Metro Vision Plan primary objectives. The qualitative scores were also the primary input for the 2050 MVRTP Regional Evaluation Panel (Panel).

The Panel, comprised of one staff representative from each of the county transportation forums, mountain counties, and staff from CDOT, RTD, and DRCOG, met on September 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> to review the list of candidate projects and their qualitative scoring results. The purpose of the panel was to provide input to the subsequent interagency process (described below) for further developing fiscally constrained multimodal project investment recommendations. The Panel's input is described in the presentation (Attachment 1).

As part of this phase of the planning process, DRCOG staff also convened the Youth Advisory Panel (YAP) and Civic Advisory Group (CAG) (see the <u>2050 MVRTP webpage</u> for more information about both groups) to seek their input.

#### Draft 2050 Project Investment Priorities Overview

The proposed 2050 MVRTP fiscally constrained project investment priorities are shown in several formats.

- Attachment 3 shows the proposed list primarily by agency funding source for regionally funded projects (DRCOG, CDOT, RTD, and interagency).
- Attachment 4 shows the proposed list of regionally funded projects by county.
- Attachment 5 shows the proposed locally funded projects based on two rounds of outreach to local governments during the 2050 planning process.
- Attachment 6 is a map of the proposed financially constrained projects (for those projects that can be mapped) shown by air quality staging period and regionally funded vs. locally funded.

To reach fiscal constraint, the interagency (DRCOG, CDOT, RTD) process incorporated <u>all input to date in the 2050 planning process</u> and emphasized these factors:

- Multimodal project investments consistent with the priority programs investment strategy (discussed in the next section)
- The planning/project development status of a candidate project or corridor

- Projects with some level of likely regional benefit (instead of primarily localized benefit or driven primarily by local growth/development)
- County forums' candidate project rankings
- Regional agencies' priorities
- Combining multiple versions of submitted projects and geographically adjacent projects
- geographic balance

Other important considerations of the interagency process to reach fiscal constraint included:

- Additional regional revenue was added to the overall fiscal constraint (\$818 million between 2025 and 2050).
- Even so, there was a multi-billion dollar gap to close to reach fiscal constraint (initially about \$5 billion).
- For projects that had to be excluded from fiscal constraint, a "multiple rationale" strategy was used. In other words, projects were excluded that ranked low on a forum's priority list <u>and</u> ranked low in DRCOG staff's Metro Vision/FAST Act qualitative scoring <u>and</u> had additional rationale(s) for not being included in fiscal constraint. (Example additional rationales include primarily local-growth driven, project implementation timeframe, etc.)

Candidate programmatic, non-air quality regionally significant capacity projects, and pre-construction activities for air quality regionally significant capacity projects not specifically listed in Attachments 3 and 4, will be eligible to compete for future TIP funding consistent with MVRTP programmatic investment priorities. They could also be funded locally.

Locally funded projects (those funded completely by a local government, toll highway authority, or other non-regional funds), shown in Attachment 5, are carried forward from the 2040 MVRTP with two rounds of project sponsor-requested updates. Note that regional fiscal constraint decisions for projects in Attachments 3 and 4, once made, may result in additions or deletions to the locally funded projects in Attachment 5.

#### Draft 2050 Priority Programs Investment Strategy Overview

The region's transportation planning priorities are expressed in the MVRTP in a variety of ways – as specific projects, project type categories, financial plan allocations, text/narrative, etc. The interagency partners believe the 2050 financial plan should communicate regional investment priorities through its structure and resource allocations to specific project types and categories, as discussed below.

Attachment 3 shows the draft priority programs investment strategy, which contains the following elements:

• <u>TIP set-asides</u>: While the exact nature of the TIP set-asides may change over time, Attachment 3 emphasizes continued dedicated investment in community mobility planning and implementation, regional transportation operations and

technology, regional air quality, transportation demand management, and human service transportation as policy priorities for the region.

- Regional BRT network: The 2050 MVRTP will be a key implementation tool for RTD's Regional BRT Feasibility Study, and the interagency process is recommending a set of BRT corridor investments in the plan in addition to the SH-119 BRT and Colfax BRT projects contained in the 2040 MVRTP. These proposed BRT corridors represent a balance of corridors that can leverage federal funding opportunities, have high ridership demand, readiness, and regional equity.
- <u>Transit planning investments</u>: The interagency process is also recommending significant investment in several corridors (such as SH-7, US-287, and others) and regional mobility hubs to improve the region's future transit options and multimodal mobility.
- Arterial safety/regional vision zero: Building on the innovative partnership between DRCOG and CDOT for the <u>Safer Main Streets program</u> and the work of both agencies on safety (DRCOG's <u>Taking Action on Regional Vision Zero</u> and CDOT's <u>Strategic Transportation Safety Plan</u>), the interagency process is recommending a dedicated safety program for the 2050 MVRTP emphasizing arterial safety and vulnerable user safety.
- <u>Active transportation</u>: Another interagency proposal is to continue implementation of DRCOG's <u>Active Transportation Plan</u> through a dedicated program in the 2050 MVRTP to continue building out the region's regional trail network, eliminate gaps, and invest in the plan's pedestrian focus areas and short trip opportunity zones.
- <u>Freight</u>: Both <u>DRCOG</u> and <u>CDOT</u> have recently adopted multimodal freight plans. DRCOG's Transportation Advisory Committee recommended that the 2050 MVRTP also contain a dedicated program focused on freight-related investments over time.
- 2040 MVRTP carryover projects: Several projects from the 2040 MVRTP are automatically carrying over to the 2050 MVRTP, and the 2050 financial plan also accounts for these projects.
- Other categories: The final 2050 MVRTP financial plan will have additional programmatic categories for maintenance, asset management, and other routine expenditures to provide a complete picture of the region's multimodal transportation investments through 2050.

In summary, the proposed priority programs investment strategy focuses on the major topics of proposed dedicated investment in the 2050 MVRTP to address the region's shared priorities around safety, air quality, multimodal mobility, and others.

#### Conclusion

DRCOG staff will discuss the draft fiscally constrained project and program investment priorities at the November 4<sup>th</sup> Board work session. These projects, once approved by

the Board in November, will be the basis of air quality conformity modeling conducted for the 2050 MVRTP.




