SUMMARY

In December 2016, DRCOG released a Request for Proposal (RFP) to solicit proposals from planning consulting firms qualified and experienced in the development of long range and strategic transportation plans, specifically in the development of Active Transportation (bicycle, pedestrian, and non-motorized) Plans.

The purpose of the DRCOG AT Plan is to develop a regionally-shared vision and implementable plan, and products to support the development of a robust AT system in the DRCOG region that:

- Provides access to AT for all ages, ability and income levels.
- Provides AT solutions for all community types within the region (urban, suburban and rural).
- Connects efficiently and intuitively to the regional transportation system, enabling multimodal travel through first and final mile infrastructure and solutions.
- Supports DRCOG's Metro Vision and 2040 Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan.

DRCOG received five submittals in response to the RFP which are currently being reviewed and evaluated by a committee selection panel. The panel includes DRCOG's Transportation Advisory Committee chair and subject matter expert staff from CDOT, RTD, and DRCOG. All five consulting teams will interview on February 7 and a final selection will be made prior to the February 15 Finance and Budget Committee meeting.

DRCOG staff recommends the Finance and Budget Committee authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and execute a contract with the selected consultant. The total contract amount is \$225,000. Funds have been allocated to this task in DRCOG's current FY 2016-FY 2017 Unified Planning Work Program.

SUMMARY

The Denver Regional Council of Governments is designated by the State of Colorado as the Area Agency on Aging (AAA) for the eight-county Denver metro region. DRCOG staff currently assist individuals with benefits and provide benefit information and advocacy.

SHIP is a federally funded program to help individuals navigate the broad range of benefits options available under Medicare and Medicaid. Under the program, health-benefits counseling, application assistance and advocacy services are offered for free to eligible seniors.

The Colorado SHIP asked DRCOG AAA to provide this service because it aligns well with DRCOG's role as the regional Aging and Disability Resources Center (ADRC). The ADRC exists to provide streamlined options counseling, information and access assistance involving services for older adults as well as adults with disabilities.

The Colorado SHIP proposes to provide funding totaling up to \$240,000 annually. Funds will provide cost to hire two dedicated paid staff, train and certify existing staff, provide educational materials and conduct a number of support sites during open enrollment periods.

The SHIP program is in the middle of the federal fiscal year. The AAA will start by serving the counties of Arapahoe, Douglas and Jefferson and will add the remaining 5 counties in the AAA's service area in October 2017.

Eligible Are:

- ✓ Any elected official or private individual, <u>excluding</u> DRCOG staff members and DRCOG Finance and Budget Committee members.
- ✓ Residents of Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Clear Creek, Douglas, Gilpin, Jefferson, or Weld counties, the City & County of Broomfield and the City & County of Denver.
- ✓ Individuals making substantial contributions to the <u>Philosophy of Regionalism</u>, either during the past year or over a longer period of time.
- ✓ Nominees whose names have been submitted for consideration the previous two years.

The Nominee(s) must have demonstrated dedication to regionalism by:

- ✓ Promotion of coordination and cooperation among citizens and local elected officials in a continuing effort to solve regional problems.
- Recognizing that jurisdictional boundaries are not barriers to the solution of such problems.
- ✓ Providing leadership to, or support for, the concept that strong local government representation is the basis for regional accomplishment.

Nomination Process:

- ✓ Nominations must include a description of the achievement, accompanied by an explanation of the nominee's (nominees') philosophy of regionalism. The narrative should be in sufficient detail to assist the Committee in its selection.
- ✓ Nominations must be submitted online at www.drcog.org by January 31.2017 for selection by the Committee at its February meeting.
- ✓ If the Committee determines that no nominee fully meets established criteria, no award will be made.
- ✓ Announcement of the winner and presentation of the award will be made at the DRCOG Awards Dinner.

2017 DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD NOMINEES

Carla Perez

Carla Perez is currently on staff with Jacobs Engineering. Perez served on the Sustainable Communities Initiative executive committee and was frequently consulted on issues and political strategies. Perez is an active member of Move Colorado, a transportation funding advocacy and education outreach group. Perez has long been involved with seeking increased, predictable and sustainable funding for transportation. She served on the board of directors for Transit Alliance, a DRCOG partner, as well as having served as transportation policy advisor to Governor Bill Ritter. Perez spent several years at the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) under the tutelage of Bill Vidal, former CDOT and DRCOG executive director.

Rick Garcia

Rick Garcia recently stepped down as director of Housing and Urban Development Region 8, headquartered in Denver. Garcia was a major supporter and advocate for both the City and County of Denver and DRCOG's successful applications for Sustainable Communities Initiative grants and was instrumental in DRCOG's award and subsequent implementation of a \$4.5 million SCI grant. Garcia was elected to the Denver City Council in 2003. Mr. Garcia served on the RTD board, through which he helped ensure passage of the FasTracks Initiative. He served on the DRCOG Board of Directors for six years, including four years as a Board officer.

George Thorn

George Thorn is president and founder of Mile High Development, a well-known and respected development firm in the Denver region. Thorn served on the Metro Vision Implementation Task Force from September 2011 through March 2014, the advisory group that initiated the DRCOG *Regional Housing Diversity Study* which identified construction defects as a major barrier to achieving Metro Vision 2035 housing goals. Thorn has been engaged in and supportive of DRCOG's Area Agency on Aging activities.

Jim Riesberg

Jim Riesberg is a former state representative who carried legislation three years in a row to increase state funding for senior services. DRCOG typically receives about 40 percent of that funding for services to older adults in the metro area. More recently, with his experience in the General Assembly and a master's degree in gerontology, Riesberg was appointed to the Strategic Action Planning Group on Aging, which was created pursuant to a bill sponsored by DRCOG (HB 15-1033), and currently serves as the group's chairman. Riesberg has consistently been a proponent of DRCOG's Area Agency on Aging (as well as the other AAAs in the state) and is a long-time, respected advocate for Colorado's older adults.

Betsy Jacobsen

Betsy Jacobsen is the bicycle and pedestrian section manager for the Colorado Department of Transportation. She is passionate about active transportation and works statewide to promote healthy mobility choices. For more than 10 years, Betsy has worked closely with the DRCOG transportation demand management team on Bike to Work Day. Jacobsen effectively manages the Congestion Mitigation Air Quality funds used for bicycle, pedestrian and social marketing projects, as well as the innovative Way to Go partnership. She has worked on many important initiatives at CDOT, including Share the Road and Safe Routes to School campaigns, as well as the statewide bicycling and scenic byways map. Jacobsen is a true collaborator, lending support to countless jurisdictional efforts. Her support of these efforts and her contributions have clearly made a lasting positive impact in communities across the DRCOG region and the state.

Sheila Bugdanowitz (posthumous)

Bugdanowitz served as the president and CEO of the Rose Community Foundation and guided the work of the foundation since 1998. The foundation was formed in 1995, so Bugdanowitz was at its helm during most of its existence. Bugdanowitz directed the foundation's development, grant-making, financial management and marketing functions, reflecting the leadership of the board of trustees. Prior to joining the foundation, Bugdanowitz was vice president of Colorado Carphone, directing the company's wireless communications and managing major accounts and 20 full-time employees. She served on the board of Mountain States Employers Council and was a member of the Women's Forum of Colorado. Bugdanowitz also served on the boards of the Colorado Health Institute, the Denver Metro Chamber of Commerce and Children's Hospital Colorado, where she also was board chairwoman. Under Bugdanowitz's direction, Rose Community Foundation was a supporter of many initiatives to support healthy and successful aging across the region. Recent efforts include supporting Jefferson County's Aging Well efforts, Denver's Age Matters Initiative and GLBT Community Center in Denver, naturally occurring retirement communities in Edgewater and Wheat Ridge, and the Latino Age Wave.

Roberto Rey

Roberto Rey is the associate state director for multicultural outreach for AARP Colorado. Rey also serves as the staff lead for AARP Colorado's Livable Communities work. Rey has been a champion of DRCOG's Boomer Bond efforts since the beginning of the program and has been instrumental in garnering financial support for the program. In 2016, Rey worked closely with DRCOG staff to bring a national conference of regional leaders on age-friendly and livable communities to the Denver region. The event was hosted at DRCOG in June 2016. Roberto also serves on the Denver Regional Mobility and Access Council board of directors.

Dace West

Dace West is the executive director of Mile High Connects, a broad-based collaborative working to ensure that the metro Denver transit system fosters communities that offer all residents the opportunity for a high quality of life. West provides leadership and partner

support around the organization's research, policy advocacy, organizing, grant-making and integration efforts. Under West's leadership, Mile High Connects has worked closely with DRCOG on numerous successful initiatives including the Sustainable Communities Initiative and the Regional Equity Atlas.

Bryan Weimer

Bryan Weimer, Arapahoe County Transportation Division manager, has participated on DRCOG transportation planning committees and efforts for nearly 30 years. Weimer's experience with the county includes positions as development review engineer, capital improvement engineer and capital improvement program manager. Weimer has been a long-standing member or participant on the DRCOG Transportation Advisory Committee and countless ad hoc committees dealing with the Transportation Improvement Program, Regional Transportation Plan and other subjects. He regularly offers timely, thought-provoking advice to keep committee meetings on track toward wise and effective decisions.
