






Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:05 p.m.; a quorum was present.

Public Comment

No public comment was received.

Summary of November 4, 2015 Meeting

The summary was accepted as submitted.

<u>Discussion of a recommendation to the Regional Transportation Committee and DRCOG</u>

<u>Board of Directors on the selection protocol for projects not funded in the 2016-2021</u>

<u>Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)</u>

Todd Cottrell briefed members on the requested action. While the members acted on the waiting list, action was not taken for the protocol for selection of projects.

Ashley Stolzmann **moved** to recommend the protocol to the Regional Transportation Committee and DRCOG Board the waiting list protocol for the 2016-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) as shown in Attachment 2. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

<u>Discussion of direction for staff on the inclusion of Outcome 7 in the Metro Vision</u>
<u>"Overarching Themes and Outcomes" recommendation to the DRCOG Board of Directors</u>
Brad Calvert provided a brief overview of the issue for discussion. Members discussed Outcome 7.

No public comment was received

Herb Atchison **moved** to remove Outcome 7 and moving 7.3 a, c and f to Outcomes 6, 15, and 8 as recommended by staff. The motion was **seconded**. There was discussion.

Members discussed Outcome 7 at length. Support and opposition were expressed for the motion. Members discussed how objective overlap and redundancy will be dealt with throughout the document. A comment was made that staff previously mentioned moving the items to other locations in the

document, and suggested that this should be made part of the motion. The maker and second of the motion accepted this amendment.

Ron Rakowsky called the question. The motion to stop debate was **seconded** and **passed** with 16 in favor.

After discussion, the motion **passed** as amended with 13 in favor and 5 opposed.

<u>Discussion of 2040 Metro Vision Plan Draft's "Overarching Themes and Outcomes" for</u> recommendation to the Board later this year

Brad Calvert reported on items left over from the previous meeting. Next steps were discussed. Members reviewed the staff-revised language for narratives in Outcomes 12, 13 and 16, as requested at the last meeting.

Outcome 12:

Anthony Graves **moved** to recommend approval of the narrative for Outcome 12 as presented by staff. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously

Outcome 13:

Saoirse Charis-Graves **moved** to recommend approval of the narrative for Outcome 13 with minor grammatical changes to the first sentence. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

Outcome 16:

Herb Atchison **moved** to recommend approval of the narrative for Outcome 16 as recommended by staff. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

<u>Discussion of Selection of Members (2) and Alternates (at least 4) to serve on the Regional Transportation Committee (RTC)</u>

SUMMARY

In August MVIC began its full review and markup of the 2040 Metro Vision Draft Plan. Over the past few months the committee has focused on "Overarching Themes and Outcomes" in the draft plan. In January the Board of Directors approved the 5 Overarching Themes and 14 Outcomes recommended by MVIC.

MVIC has used DRCOG's Strategic Framework (Attachment 1) to guide the committee's review of the plan and subsequent recommendations to the Board. With Board adoption of the overarching themes and outcomes MVIC will now focus its attention on plan objectives. Objectives identify continuous improvements needed to achieve a desired outcome.

As noted previously the March draft of the plan included 168 objectives and corresponding narratives. Based on guidance from MVIC in November DRCOG staff is recommending a reduced set of objectives (51) for inclusion in the plan. All objectives previously included in the draft are shown in attachments as described below.

- Attachment 2 includes Board adopted outcomes paired with staff recommended objectives culled from the March draft.
- Attachment 3 includes two sections within the table:
 - Objectives associated with outcomes not approved by the Board
 - Objectives that upon further examination by staff have been classified as initiatives.

In February MVIC will review and recommend objectives to the Board of Directors. Attachment 2 will be the primary discussion document for the meeting. Attachment 3 is provided in the event there is interest from MVIC to retain objectives under previously removed outcomes or the committee would like to explore drafting a regional objective from the list of objectives in the March draft now classified as initiatives. Narratives associated with each objective will be reviewed once a final set of objectives is agreed upon. As noted above a significant number of objectives in the March draft have now been classified as strategic initiatives. Unless retained by MVIC as an objective, these initiatives will be reviewed at future meetings.
