#### **SUBJECT**

#### SUMMARY

DRCOG's Aging and Disability Resources Center for Colorado (ADRC) is designated by the State as a regional provider for the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP). SHIP is a federally funded program to help individuals navigate the broad range of benefits options available under Medicare. Under the program, the ADRC performs extensive Medicare outreach and provides health-benefits counseling and education for free to eligible seniors. In addition to these activities, federal funds received by the ADRC support Medicare enrollment assistance and advocacy services, as well as Medicare fraud education and prevention.

The ADRC has operated the SHIP program for over two years to primarily serve seniors residing in Arapahoe, Douglas and Jefferson counties. The funding projected for the next year is estimated to be as high as \$240,000. Funds will be used to support the work of three dedicated full-time staff members, as well as to pay for ongoing training and certification, educational materials and for hosting a number of support sites during open enrollment periods. The program utilizes the help of many active volunteers.

#### **SUMMARY**

For the past five years, DRCOG has had an agreement with HCPF to provide options counseling to residents of long-term care facilities who desire to transition out of those facilities. The Community Options Program, previously referred to as the Colorado Choice Transitions (CCT) program, was established to help ease the transition of individuals in long-term care facilities back into their homes or other communities of choice. In addition to providing options counseling services, AAA staff perform other duties such as establishing community partnerships, developing local resources, conducting outreach and education, and making referrals for transition coordination.

The intergovernmental agreement with HCPF was recently extended an additional two months to expire August 2019 as the agency finalizes a new agreement that will include options for up to four additional one-year extensions. Total funding for the first year is estimated at \$300,000, which factors a yearend incentive payment of up to \$20,000.

The funding supports the work of three full-time transitions options counselors covering the Denver metro region.

#### SUMMARY

DRCOG is designated by the State as the Area Agency on Aging (AAA) for the 8-county Denver metro region. It receives and administers federal Older Americans Act (OAA) and State Funding for Senior Services (SFSS) monies through its contract with the Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) to fund services that enable older adults to live independently and in their communities of choice. Services are offered to area adults age 60 and older and their caregivers at no charge.

At least every two years the AAA releases a Request for Proposals (RFP), seeking to contract with community-based service providers. Pursuant to an RFP for the state fiscal period of 2019-2021, the Board Finance and Budget Committee approved the first-year allocations to providers as recommended by the AAA's Advisory Committee on Aging (ACA). Since funding from CDHS had not yet been finalized when the recommendations were made and considering other factors such as program changes or a provider's inability to expend current year funds, some funding allocations were anticipated to change prior to contracts being issued.

DRCOG was notified of its available funding from CDHS in April 2019, which was after the initial funding allocations were approved by the Finance and Budget Committee. DRCOG has since issued 37 contracts with 27 providers for the fiscal year of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The final allocations by provider are attached for information.

#### Notes:

- (1) Arapahoe County proposed transportation service for the eastern plains area will likely be accommodated through a separate DRCOG-run voucher transportation program
- (2) Catholic Health Initiatives/ Centura HealthSET initial allocation was an increase from the current year. The provider has since notified DRCOG that it is returning \$25K in SFY2019 state funds; the SFY2020 grant was decreased accordingly. Provider has returned grant funds in previous years.
- (3) Center for People with Disabilities the allocation was reduced to reflect a lower actual level of funding for visually impaired services. The grant amount for special adaptive equipment/material aid was specifically reduced to be level with funding for that particular service in SFY2019.
- (4) Lutheran Family Services the provider requested that funds be shifted to reflect current changes in service demand. Demographic changes have resulted in a reduced need for caregiver counseling support groups and an increased demand for access assistance and caregiver respite care.
- (5) Southwest Improvement Council material aid (personal care items) and bus ticket transportation were included in the original proposal. These were later carved out as separate services.
