MINUTES FINANCE AND BUDGET COMMITTEE Wednesday, March 21, 2018

Chair Ashley Stolzmann called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. with a guorum present.

Move to Adopt the Consent Agenda

Director Fifer **moved** to adopt the consent agenda. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

Items on the consent agenda included:

Election of Vice Chair

Director Shaw expressed interest in serving as Vice Chair for the coming year.

Director Baker **moved** to appoint Director Shaw as Vice Chair of the Finance and Budget Committee. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

<u>Discussion of a resolution authorizing the Executive Director to negotiate and execute contracts with the partner organizations of Denver Regional Accountable Health Community (AHC) in the amount of approximately \$1.91 million

Jenny Dock, Accounting Services Manager, and Jayla Sanchez-Warren, Director, Area Agency on Aging, briefed members on this item. The purpose is to allow payment of funds</u>

to partner organizations to provide services in accordance with the AHC grant contract.

Director Baker **moved** to approve <u>Resolution No. 8, 2018</u> authorizing the Executive Director to negotiate and execute contracts with the clinical, behavioral health, and community partners of the DRCOG Accountable Health Communities grant in the amount of approximately \$1.91 million commencing

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after May 1, 2018 and continuing for four years. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

<u>Discussion of a resolution authorizing the Executive Director to negotiate and execute a contract with the City of Aurora in the amount of \$80,000 for a one-year term to expand senior transportation services in Aurora</u>

Jayla Sanchez-Warren reported the City of Aurora intends to enter into a formal agreement with DRCOG to help coordinate transportation services in the City of Aurora. In December 2017 the Aurora City Council approved an annual allocation of \$80,000 for the services. The City of Aurora will enter into a formal agreement with DRCOG to help coordinate the services and manage the funds. DRCOG will work with the city to draft a plan for utilizing the funds for the first year.

Director Shaw **moved** to adopt <u>Resolution No. 9, 2018</u> authorizing the Executive Director to execute a contract with the City of Aurora in the amount of \$80,000 for a one-year term to expand senior transportation services in Aurora. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

<u>Discussion of a resolution authorizing the Executive Director to execute a contract with the NextFifty Initiative in the amount of \$250,000 to support the Area Agency on Aging Accountable Health Communities (AHC) program</u>

Jayla Sanchez Warren, AJ Diamontopoulos and Kirsti Klaverkamp, DRCOG staff, briefed members on the item. The proposed grant will allow DROCG to pay for and expand the capacity of community-based services for older adults. The budget is for a two-year period with \$125,000 provided annually.

Director Fifer **moved** to adopt <u>Resolution No. 10, 2018</u> authorizing the Executive Director to execute a contract with the NextFifty Initiative in the amount of \$250,000 to support the Area Agency on Aging Accountable Health Communities program in expanding capacity of community-based services for older adults. The motion was **seconded** and **passed** unanimously.

Presentation on Area Agency on Aging audit

Jenny Dock and Jayla Sanchez-Warren provided an overview of recent audits conducted on the Area Agency on Aging. The Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) procured an independent audit of state AAAs in mid-2017, focused on accounting and contract administration practices. It also reviewed the financial and operating practices of the AAA's nutrition, transportation, case management and family caregiver programs. A final report was sent to DRCOG in January 2018 that listed no compliance issues. The focus of the second audit, conducted in October and November 2017, were the nutrition, homemaker/personal care, vision/hearing material aid, transportation and visual impairment services. The annual evaluation report was sent to DRCOG in December 2017. None of the items listed in the report were of a material nature, and all had either been resolved within 30 days of the report or officially removed by the State Unit on Aging following an explanation from DRCOG.

SUBJECT

SUMMARY

DRCOG is designated by the State as the Area Agency on Aging for the 8-county metro region. It receives funding through the Colorado Department of Human Services as authorized by the federal Older Americans Act and the Older Coloradans Act. DRCOG in turn awards grant funds to over two dozen organizations to provide area older adults and their caregivers with services that promote their wellbeing and independence.

DRCOG intends to extend option letters to AAA providers to continue services for another fiscal year commencing July 1, 2018. DRCOG and its Advisory Committee on Aging (ACA) have reviewed the providers' proposed 2018-2019 budgets and have recommended funding amounts based on current fiscal year contractor pass-through funds of \$12.1 million. Funding for the 2018-2019 state fiscal year has not been finalized but projections indicate that the level of pass-through funds may be as high as \$16.5 million. As such, contract amounts are an estimate and are subject to available funds. The ACA will continue to evaluate funding levels and will make recommendations for sub-recipient awards accordingly.

SUMMARY

DRCOG's Area Agency on Aging is sponsor and regular co-host of No Copay Radio, a weekly AM radio program and podcast. The program provides important health news and other topics relevant to older adults. With a growing listener base of thousands of people, it is a valuable source of information, education and outreach.

The Nextfifty Initiative is a Colorado-based foundation that support organizations committed to serving the elderly population and their caregivers. The foundation plans to give up to \$90,000 to DRCOG to continue No Copay programming, with an initial amount of \$45,000 to cover weekly shows for six months through December 2018. The sponsorship funds are not directly given by the foundation to the radio station as they must be distributed through a not-for-profit organization.
