Regional Share Framework for the 2020-2023 TIP

Purpose

Applications are limited to regional projects/programs that play a crucial role in shaping and sustaining the future of individuals, cities, and counties in the DRCOG region. Regional projects/programs should directly address established TIP Focus Areas through a systems approach focused on enhancing regional connections, regardless of travel mode. Regional projects/programs should connect communities; improve mobility and access, while providing a high return on investment to the region consistent with Metro Vision and the 2040 Regional Transportation Plan.

"Project" Eligibility

Projects funded through DRCOG's Regional Share shall address major multimodal¹ capacity, reconstruction, and operational improvements that implement the Fiscally Constrained Regional Transportation Plan:

- 2. Projects funded through the DRCOG TIP Regional Share must leverage other significant funding resources. DRCOG allocated funds should represent no more than XX percent of the total project cost. Projects must adhere to the Board's adopted focus area(s).
- 3. Any unallocated Regional Share funds will be proportionately allocated to the predefined subregions for their respective calls for projects.

"Program" Eligibility

Programs funded through DRCOG's Regional Share shall address mobility issues to a level that can definitively illustrate a "magnitude of benefits" fitting of a regional program. Regional programs will focus on optimizing the multimodal transportation system and/or programmatic efforts to ensure that people of all ages, incomes, and abilities are connected to their communities and the larger region.

Working Definition of a 'Regional Project':

Any <u>federally-eligible</u> project that directly extends, completes, <u>or</u> addresses an operational/safety need, or provides independent utility on a segment(s) or segments <u>providing independent utility</u> identified on one or more of the regional transportation networks under the <u>SMRTS</u> is eligible for regional funding network.

Other Working Tenets of Regional Funding Share:

Only projects identified on the <u>qualifying networks depicted on the</u> referenced maps in the above table are eligible to compete for <u>the</u> regional funding share.

All <u>submitted</u> regional projects <u>unfunded or partially</u> funded or not through the regional funding share, are eligible for the subregional process at the subregion(s) discretion.

<u>Projects funded through the DRCOG TIP Regional Share Rregional Ily fundinged projects is considered</u> "last-in funds" and must leverage other significant funding resources. <u>DRCOG allocated funds should</u> represent no more than XX percent of the total project cost. <u>Projects must</u>, should be considered the "last funds in", and adhere to the Board's adopted focus area(s).

A MAXIMUM 30% of funding COULD BE allocated for regional projects.

Any unallocated <u>Regional Share</u>regional funds <u>will go back to the be available</u> should be divided equally amongfor the <u>S</u>subregion <u>Shares</u> to program.
