

What is the Denver Regional Visual Resources (DRVR) project?

DRVR is an online repository of data-driven stories and infographics that explain transportation issues, employment and population trends, land use, and aging in the Denver region.

Why did DRCOG create DRVR?

DRVR is an effort to turn data into information using interactive and engaging visualizations and tools. These resources are meant to explain issues quickly and clearly, to provide a basis for discussion, and inform decision-making.

Who is DRVR for?

DRVR is a public tool meant to reach a wide audience. Our goal is to empower anyone with an interest in local and regional planning topics – local and state officials, community and advocacy groups, students and citizens.

What can DRVR do?

- Provide regional context and local insight on key topics like transportation, land use, and aging.
- Support data-driven decision making by showcasing important data topics in an interactive, dynamic, and engaging way.

- What will rush hour look like in 2040?
- Where do different generations prefer to live?
- How do our cities and counties differ demographically?
- How do we commute to work and how does that differ from other places in the nation?
