

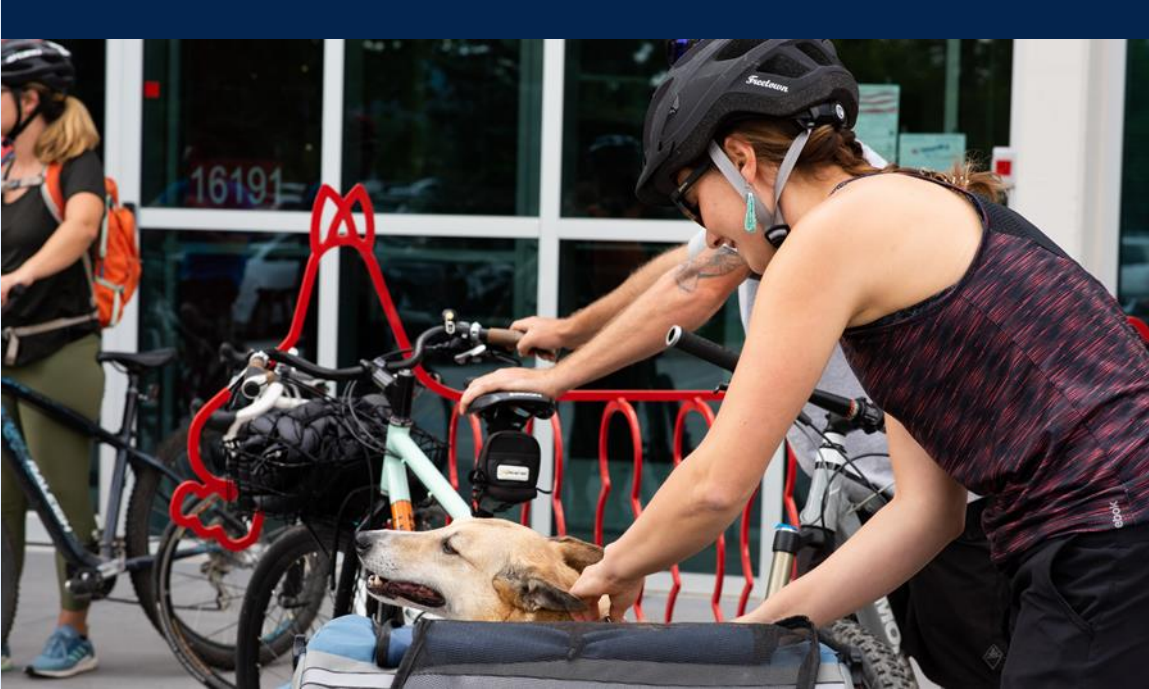


Taking stock and looking ahead

Participants pedal half a million miles on Bike to Work Day

An estimated 31,190 riders traveled 548,944 miles – or greater than a trip to the moon and back – on Wednesday, June 26, for the region’s annual Bike to Work Day. This year’s Bike to Work Day highlights include:

- 39% of riders were first-time participants
- 777 businesses and organizations participated in the Business Challenge
- 281 breakfast, water and evening stations
- average one-way commute was 8.8 miles
- 237 tons of carbon dioxide saved
- 34.1 million calories burned

Business Challenge winners included Dig Studio among small companies and DaVita among large businesses. Overall winners included Plexus, Davis Partnership Architects and Navigant.

Although organized by DRCOG's [Way to Go](#) team, Bike to Work Day is truly a community event made possible by your cities, towns, counties, businesses, employees and residents.

TIP spotlight: Aurora's Westerly Creek Trail to Toll Gate Trail Connector

The City of Aurora just started construction on a project to provide first- and last-mile connection to transit which includes two-way separated bike lanes on Florida Avenue. With an emphasis on bicyclist safety and comfort, the project will also connect Westerly Creek Trail to Toll Gate Trail.

The project will leverage \$8.5 million in DRCOG-allocated funds and \$3.1 million in local funds. Improvements will include roadway reconfiguration to incorporate on-street bicycle lanes; pavement markings, signage, lighting and physical separation for bicycle facilities; intersection and midblock crossing improvements; a Florida Station Kiss-n-Ride area and bicycle racks.



Shotwell named 2018 Employee of the Year

At its all-staff meeting June 11, DRCOG recognized Andi Shotwell, human resources generalist, as 2018 Employee of the Year. I presented her with a custom glass sculpture incorporating DRCOG's blue and green logo colors, created by Blake Street Glass.

Shotwell was nominated by eight of her fellow employees. In his nomination, Jerry Stigall, director, organizational development, noted:

Regional Vision Zero efforts commence



In concert with global, state and community efforts to end traffic fatalities, DRCOG has launched a [Regional Vision Zero](#) initiative. The action plan will identify strategies to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries in the Denver region.

The process will be shaped in coordination with an extensive stakeholder group. Robust public engagement will begin in August. Staff anticipates the draft plan will be ready for Board review in early spring 2020 and consideration for adoption in summer 2020.

DRCOG is kicking off development of the 2050 Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan, which guides development of the region's future multimodal transportation system.

July 30 Metro Vision Idea Exchange webinar

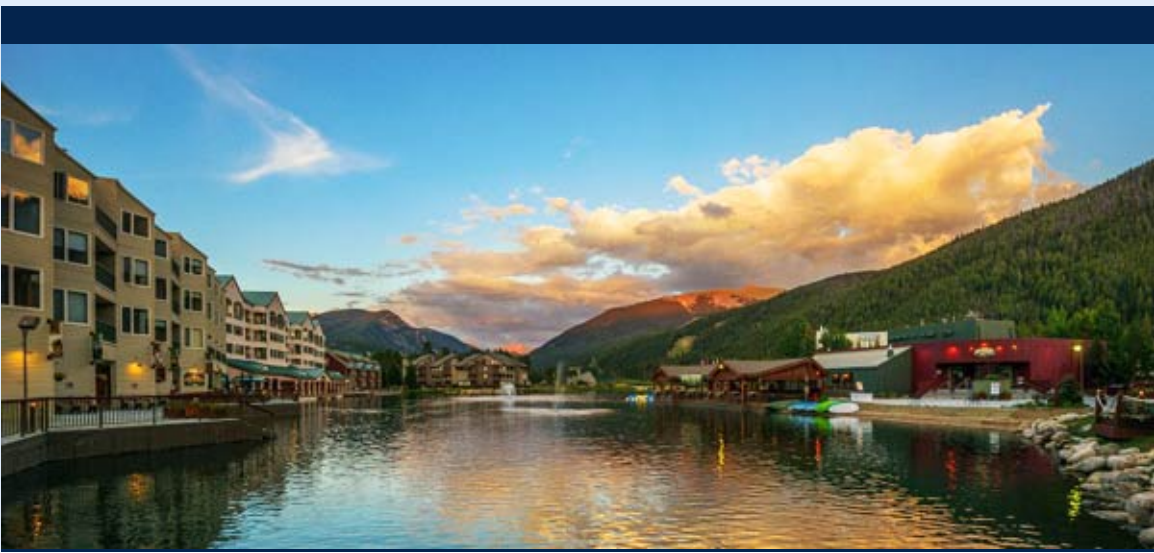
highlights engagement strategies
