HELP stakeholders develop clear goals and objectives for TDM within the context of Metro Vision and other regional and local plans


IDENTIFY strategies, partnerships, policies, and a framework to deliver regional TDM to achieve identified goals and objectives

PROJECT OVERVIEW: UPDATES




- Began last fall forming the Steering Committee and identifying high-level goals.
- During this period we have been developing existing conditions analysis to help inform the remainder of the project.







2050 RTP





MULTIMODAL CONNECTIVITY

TDM strategies improve connectivity across and between transportation modes to create efficient travel patterns.



Example: The Lone Tree Mobility Hub along I-25 is a transportation center that provides multiple options for people to reach their destination, such as improved sidewalks, bridges, and buses.





EQUITY IN TRANSPORTATION

TDM strategies that provide mobility benefits to marginalized communities. Equity in transportation also aims to provide everyone, regardless of their age, income, gender, race, ethnicity, or ability, with transportation access in the region.



Example: The <u>Boulder Mobility for All Technology Ambassador</u> <u>Program</u> offers technology workshops and 1-1 training to help community members of all ages and abilities use transportation apps such as Google Maps, Transit, RTD, and Lyft/Uber so they have access to transportation options.





AIR QUALITY IMPROVEMENTS

TDM strategies that can improve air quality and/or reduce greenhouse gas emissions.



Example: <u>DRCOG's Way to Go</u> program works with a group of Transportation Management Associations (TMAs) to help commuters and employers find alternatives to driving alone such as carpool and vanpool programs, and Eco-Pass and transit.





TRANSPORTATION SAFETY

TDM strategies that improve safety using our transportation network, programs and services, regardless of mode of travel.



Example: The Cherry Hills Village High Line Canal Underpass Project creates a separated, high-comfort connection for pedestrians and cyclists along the High Line Canal Trail by going underneath Hampden Ave and Colorado Blvd.


