Overview

"Subrecipient Monitoring and Risk Assessment" is a mechanism to:

- Assess risk of compliance with federal requirements. This is distinct from project-level risk assessments.
- Select candidate Local Agency projects for monitoring.
- Develop project-specific, but LA-focused monitoring, based on ongoing observations.





Why this Matters

Compliance

• With 2 CFR 200.

Coordinated Processes

 Coordinates multiple current activities (while adding a few more) and organizes them to better track processes and outputs required in 2 CFR 200.

Provides Opportunities for Project Delivery Improvement

 Provides a collaborative means for Local Agencies and CDOT to assess strengths and areas for improvement in project delivery and documentation, and financial accounting systems.



Candidate Project Monitoring Criteria

What qualifies a project for monitoring?

- Has received <u>any</u> federal funding....
- Entity determined to be a "Subrecipient".
- An executed IGA with encumbered funds.
- The project exists in FHWA's financial management system.

Each State Fiscal Year, candidate projects are identified based on Risk Level.

All <u>HIGH</u> risk projects will be monitored.

Medium and Low risk projects will be randomly selected.
