Transportation Improvement
Program call for projects (No. 3)
recommendations*

Background: On Aug. 22, DRCOG issued the third of four calls for projects (call No. 3, or the subregional share for the current fiscal year 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program) to allocate \$466.4 million in available funds from federal fiscal year 2022-2027.

During the process, DRCOG staff and representatives from each subregion provided recommendations regarding project funding.

Result: The Board approved the subregional forum [recommendations](#) regarding projects to be funded in the fiscal years 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program.

*Corridor planning program and
community-based transportation
planning program updates*

Summary: DRCOG's fiscal year 2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program identifies the development of two new planning programs to help advance the 2050 Metro Vision Regional Transportation Plan's investment priorities: a corridor planning program and a community-based transportation planning program.

*Briefing on the 2021 Annual Report
on Traffic Congestion in the Denver
Region*

Summary: DRCOG maintains a federally required congestion management process and a component of that process is the calculation of congestion measurements for roadways in the Denver region. DRCOG is also required to prepare a presentation
