**JERRY STIGALL NAMED DRCOG ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR**

**Oct. 29, 2013 (Denver, Colorado)** – Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) Executive Director Jennifer Schaufele has announced the appointment of Jerry Stigall as director of organizational development.

Stigall will oversee the regional council's efforts in the areas of strategic, administrative and organizational development. The position is new, created this year to help DRCOG strengthen its organizational strategy while building on its long and successful history and culture of regional collaboration. DRCOG, the third oldest council of governments in the nation, celebrates its sixtieth anniversary in 2015.

Stigall joined DRCOG Oct. 25 after serving as Douglas County's director of organization development, strategy and policy for 11 years. In that position, he was responsible for organizational development, training, strategy and policy development, leadership assessment and coaching, and individual contributor development. In 2012, Douglas County received an Award for Excellence from the Balanced Scorecard Institute.

He previously held positions as director of organizational development for Relera Internet Centers and Solutions, director of human resource development and organizational development for JD Edwards & Company, director of professional services for TRACOM Corporation, and manager of the JC Penney Corporate Development Center. He is a graduate of the University of North Texas with a bachelor of business administration degree, marketing major.

visionary organization as Board members and staff continue their efforts to make life better in the Denver region for people of all ages, incomes and abilities,” Schaufele said.
