



## East Corridor Photo Upload Instructions

We are gathering photos for the East Corridor using an online account via Flickr. These photos can be either positive or negative examples of specific things in the built environment, and can be from the East Corridor or examples from other places. We just ask that you label the photos using these instructions.


### Instructions for Digital Camera Users:

If you know how, please set your camera at a low-resolution setting so the files are not too large. Take photographs as you normally do, but please keep track of where you took each shot so you can include this information when you submit your photos.

To submit photos from your camera.

1. Log in to [www.flickr.com](http://www.flickr.com)
  - **login:** drcogsci
  - **password:** DRC0GSC1 (note: case matters, and the “O” is zero, and “1” is the number 1)
2. Then click on “Upload” from the top menu. You can either drag and drop photos or click on “Choose photos and videos”. Find your photos on your computer and click on upload or open.

Click on the title box and add the location (e.g., corner of Washington and 14th, or a specific address). On the right of the page, you can then click on “Add tags” and add tags that will help us sort photos as positive or negative, etc. If you want, you can write in additional comments in the “Add a description” box (e.g., this is a good example of pedestrian connections to stations, this is an example of a good job center, etc.). Please include your name if you want, so we know who is participating.



### Instructions for Cell Phone Users:

1. Take your photo as you usually do and then email or MMS it to the PlaceMatters SCI Flickr Photostream using: [sci@placematters.org](mailto:sci@placematters.org).
2. In the **subject** of the email, please put the **location** and type “**tags**” then add the tag “EC” (East Corridor) and select any more tags you want from the list below. In the body of the email, add comments if you want.
  - **Subject:** 34<sup>th</sup> and Colorado tags: PS NT PP
  - **Body:** Any additional comments
3. Once you have emailed your photo, you can also log in (see above) to make changes if you would like.

### Instructions for Photos from Other Sources:

If you would like to include photos from other sources, like a website, that is fine as long as you note (in the body of the email or in the description) where the image is from—copy and paste the URL into the description or email body so we can attribute the images.

### Tagging Codes:

To make it easier to categorize photos, please use the following codes when you “tag” your photos online or in your email. There are seven categories below and we are asking you to tag your photo as either positive (P) or negative (N) with respect to each of these categories.

You can use more than one tag for each photo—just add a space in between each code. For example, if you have a picture of a closed store front, that might be Negative Retail (NR) and Negative Safety (NS). For barriers, a Positive Barrier code might indicate a place where a feature (like a pedestrian overpass) overcomes a barrier.

Category	Positive	Negative
<b>Accessibility:</b> wheelchairs, strollers, vision impaired, etc.	PA	NA
<b>Retail:</b> what is available? Is it appropriate?	PR	NR
<b>Public plazas,</b> parks and other open/gathering spaces	PPS	NPS
<b>Transit:</b> is transit effectively used? Linked to environment?	PT	NT
<b>Parking:</b> appearance, user experience	PP	NP
<b>Linkage:</b> highways, fences, or other barriers to ped/bike access	PL	NL
<b>Safety:</b> perception and reality; nighttime and daytime	PS	NS
<b>Who</b> is using this space?	PW	NW
<b>Character:</b> other features that affect your experience	PC	NC
