

Description

Every two years, the Denver Regional Council of Governments facilitates the acquisition of high-resolution aerial imagery for the region. Since 2002, this project has been providing a common base map for DRAPP members and partners to use for mapping, planning and analysis.

The 2016 project encompassed approximately 7,000 square miles and included 3-inch, 6-inch and 12-inch imagery.

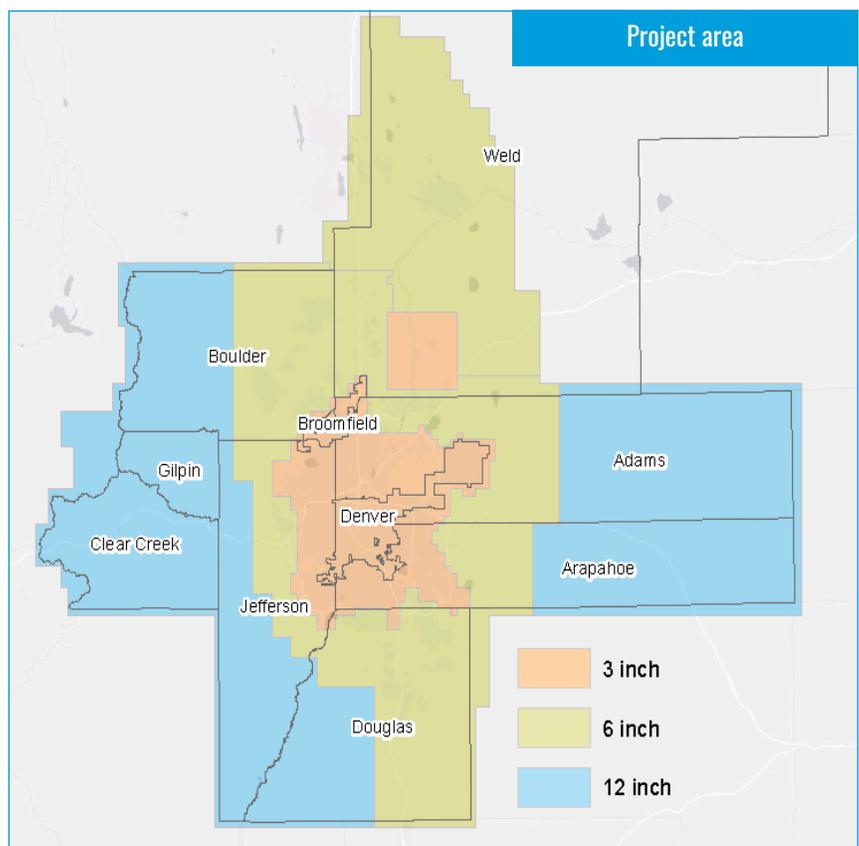
The level of partner participation keeps participant costs low, providing valuable data at a fraction of the cost. Program costs include imagery acquisition, quality reviews, post-processing, custom order delivery and DRCOG project management.

What's new in 2016?

During the 2016 project, the partnership kept costs and participation steady while increasing quality and access options. The imagery adheres to the latest positional accuracy standards suggested by the American Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing, which exceed previous specifications twofold. DRCOG also negotiated with vendors to provide two separate web map service options to stream data to partners. Finally, DRCOG worked with partners to implement a Color Committee and Survey – incorporating feedback provided by partners in the 2014 project – to proactively assess and implement partner preferences for image aesthetics.
