

Description

Every two years, the Denver Regional Council of Governments facilitates the acquisition of high-resolution aerial imagery for the region. Since 2002, this project has been providing a common base map for DRAPP members and partners to use for mapping, planning and analysis.

The 2018 project encompassed approximately 6,000 square miles and included 3-inch, 6-inch and 12-inch imagery.

DRCOG’s level of participation keeps participant costs low, providing valuable data at a fraction of the cost. Program costs include imagery acquisition, post-processing, custom order delivery and DRCOG project management.

What’s new in 2018?

During the 2018 project, DRCOG responded to a partner need for higher resolution imagery by increasing 3-inch coverage by 55 percent from the previous project. The high-resolution imagery allows for more visual analysis of assets, including accurate identification, measuring and evaluating condition. To offset the cost of acquiring more high-resolution data, DRCOG and project partners performed quality control activities instead of hiring a vendor.

To respond to its partners’ need for more frequently delivered imagery, DRCOG worked with the acquisition vendor to deliver interim imagery through a web map service immediately following the flights in March and then followed it with a color-balanced version in May. These services were of higher quality and timelier than in past projects. Additionally, DRCOG negotiated and paid for a Nearmap trial service for all project partners to determine whether it would be a suitable supplemental data source.

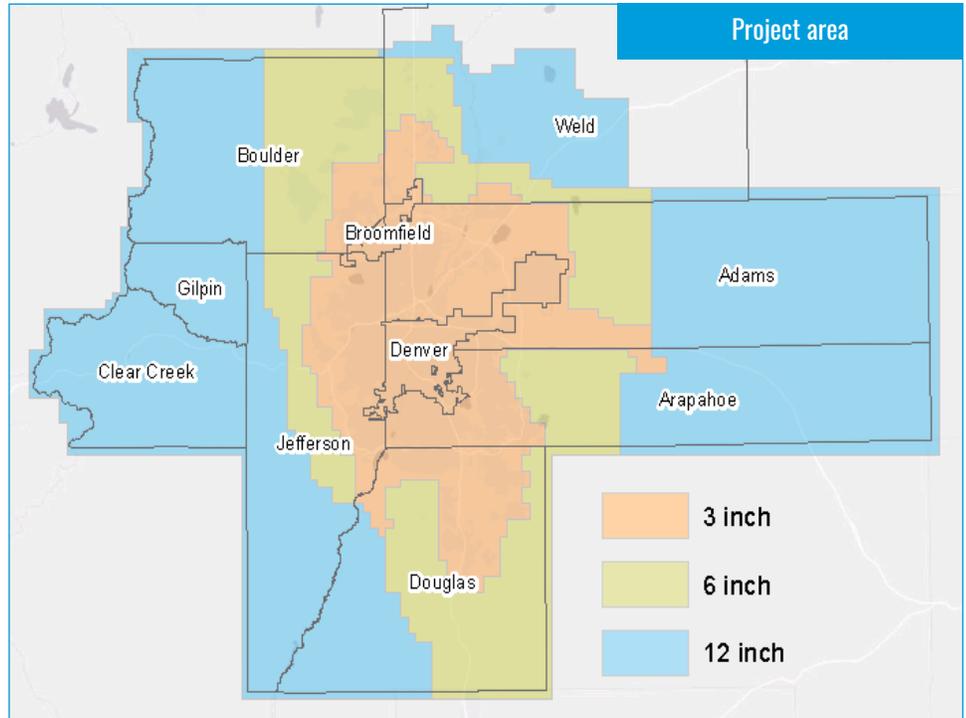
Finally, DRCOG made several operational improvements, including improving communication with Denver International Airport to ensure flight request approvals and adjusting the spring and summer flight windows to take advantage of optimal flying conditions.
